## 1 SHONDA BORDEN, affirmed, testified: 2 3 THE COURT: Mr. Russell? 4 5 DIRECT EXAMINATION 6 7 MR. RUSSELL: Thank you, Your Honour. Good afternoon, Ms. 8 Borden. 9 Α. Good afternoon. 10 If, at any point, you can't either hear me or things 11 break up, just signal or let me know somehow and we'll take a 12 break. 13 Sounds good. Α. 14 If there's something that's sort of not clear and you 15 need me to re-ask it, just, you know, indicate that you'd like 16 me to re-ask it. And if, at any point, you need a break, some 17 of the topics you may just need a break from, maybe just let me know and we can ask the Court and Judge Zimmer will probably ... 18 19 His Honour will probably allow us to take a break. 20 Α. Okay. So I might refer to you as "Shonda" because we have 21

talked in advance as Shane and Shonda. I hope that's all right.

- 1 A. Perfectly fine.
- 2 Q. So I guess I'll start by getting you to say your full
- 3 name. What is your full name?
- 4 A. Shonda Rochelle Borden.
- 5 Q. And I understand that you're currently not in Nova
- 6 Scotia. Where are you living?
- 7 A. Regina, Saskatchewan.
- 8 Q. And how long have you been in Saskatchewan?
- 9 A. Nine years, I think.
- 10 Q. And I understand you're in a nursing program now?
- 11 **A.** Yes.
- 12 Q. When did you start the nursing program?
- 13 **A.** March.
- 14 Q. So you just sort of ... I guess you've got a long
- 15 ways to go, I guess?
- 16 A. Just started, yes.
- 17 Q. And how is it going?
- 18 A. Good so far. Great.
- 19 Q. So I understand that you have a twin as well.
- 20 **A.** I do.
- 21 Q. And Shanna would be your older sister?
- 22 **A.** Yeah.

- 1 Q. And Sheldon is your twin. Sheldon Borden?
- 2 A. That's correct.
- 3 Q. How many years in the difference between you and
- 4 Shanna?
- 5 **A.** Five years.
- 6 Q. Are there any other siblings?
- 7 **A.** No.
- 8 Q. So in terms of growing up, were you, Sheldon, and
- 9 Shanna close growing up?
- 10 **A.** Yes.
- 11 Q. All right.
- 12 A. Like siblings.
- 13 Q. Yes. Okay. Sometimes you got along, I guess, and
- 14 sometimes you didn't. Is that fair?
- 15 A. That's right.
- 16 Q. All right.
- 17 THE COURT: Mr. Russell, I'm just going to stop you for
- 18 a second.
- 19 So, Ms. Borden, some of the questions that you might get
- 20 asked might seem to be kind of like simple and basic questions,
- 21 but they're important because they kind of fill in the
- 22 relationship that you had with your other family members and it

- 1 really helps us to have kind of an understanding, a better
- 2 understanding. And, you know, some of the historical data is so
- 3 well-known to you that ... but it's unknown to us. So that's
- 4 part of the reason why Mr. Russell will go through this very
- 5 carefully. And some of it may not seem all that important to
- 6 you, but it really does provide us with some important
- 7 background and context. Okay?
- 8 A. Yeah. Totally fine.
- 9 Q. Perfect. Thank you. Sorry, Mr. Russell.
- 10 MR. RUSSELL: So you would've all grown up in the same
- 11 household, I guess?
- 12 A. Yes, we did.
- 13 Q. And so who would've lived in that household growing
- 14 up?
- 15 A. Myself; my twin brother, Sheldon; Shanna, which is
- 16 obviously our older sister; and then my mother and father,
- 17 Thelma and Ricky.
- 18 Q. So Shanna, in terms of she's the big sister and there
- 19 were five years in the difference, but would you see her very
- 20 frequently? Would you always sort of know what she's up to, she
- 21 would know what you were up to, growing up?
- 22 **A.** Most of the time. She was like our second mother.

- 1 Q. All right. And so she was a little motherly, I guess,
- 2 over you and Sheldon.
- 3 A. Majorly. Yes.
- 4 Q. All right. And, well, could you give us sort of an
- 5 example.
- 6 A. Well, just when ... one time when my mother had a
- 7 stroke, she took on the motherly responsibilities of getting us
- 8 to school, and herself, and cooking breakfast and whatnot. She
- 9 always had the mother role.
- 10 Q. And I always sort of wondered. How was it like
- 11 growing up with a twin?
- 12 A. Annoying.
- 13 Q. I should point out, he can hear everything you're
- 14 saying.
- 15 A. I hope he can.
- 16 Q. And so I guess if you could tell us a little bit about
- 17 into the future. How was Shanna as a mom with Aaliyah?
- 18 A. Shanna was fantastic. Being a mother was so natural
- 19 to her. You know, she loved children. She loved taking care of
- 20 people, whether they were infants or toddlers or elderly. It
- 21 was just her dynamic.
- 22 Q. And we know that she had a successful career as a

- 1 nurse. So how was she at sort of balancing that professional
- 2 career as a nurse with being a mother?
- 3 A. She did it a lot better than what I can do. Just
- 4 multi-tasking. Especially going back and forth from New
- 5 Brunswick to Nova Scotia and then still being able to help
- 6 Aaliyah with her homework or, you know, taking her out for
- 7 activities. Plus doing her, you know, schoolwork and studying
- 8 for exams on the run is ... it's a lot of work, but she did
- 9 great at it.
- 10 (13:10)
- 11 Q. And in terms of her overall sort of presentation,
- 12 would you describe her as sort of a shy person? A confident
- 13 person?
- 14 A. Confident and social, I would say.
- 15 Q. All right.
- 16 **A.** Yeah.
- 17 Q. And in terms of when you moved to Saskatchewan -
- 18 you've been there nine years did you stay in touch with
- 19 Sheldon and Shanna during your time that you were in
- 20 Saskatchewan?
- 21 A. Yeah. So I talk to Sheldon every once in awhile, but
- 22 Shanna, we'd normally talk every day on the phone.

- 1 Q. So it was pretty ... Did you say "every day"? Or how
- 2 frequent would that be, say, in the run of a week?
- 3 A. Every day.
- 4 Q. Every day? Okay. And was that sort of the typical
- 5 relationship that you sort of both had shared was always in
- 6 regular contact and up to speed with what's going on in each
- 7 other's lives?
- 8 A. Not normally. I mean like when I graduated high
- 9 school, we became a lot closer because I was older then. And
- 10 when I had my children, I was living in Nova Scotia, obviously,
- 11 at that time. We just became even more closer. So, you know,
- 12 once you get older, you become closer with your siblings.
- 13 Q. Sure. And how old are your children?
- 14 A. Eleven and nine.
- 15 Q. So how old would you have sort of been when you moved
- 16 out of the family household? I'm assuming Shanna might've been
- 17 the first to kind of leave the family home?
- 18 A. So Shanna was the first to leave and then I left right
- 19 after graduating. So I went to go live with her and Lionel in
- 20 New Brunswick. And then I bought a house and then they came and
- 21 lived with me until they bought their house.
- 22 Q. So I'm going to ask ...

- 1 A. We spent quite a bit of time together.
- 2 Q. So I'm going to ask you just a little bit about you
- 3 living with them at different portions of time. Sort of
- 4 momentarily, we'll get into that. So do you remember how old, I
- 5 guess, would you have been, roughly, when Shanna and Lionel
- 6 might've started dating, I guess?
- 7 **A.** Geez ...
- 8 Q. It doesn't have to be perfectly accurate. I'm just
- 9 trying to get a sense of it.
- 10 A. I'd say like 16 maybe?
- 11 Q. And would Lionel sort of always ... would he come
- 12 around the house when they first started dating?
- 13 A. Yeah. Lionel used to either bike down or sometimes he
- 14 would hitchhike down, walk.
- 15 Q. And they were together approximately how many years,
- 16 would you say, before they got married?
- 17 A. I think Shanna was in grade ... Before they got
- 18 married? I'd say about six years maybe?
- 19 **Q.** And so would they have dated in high school?
- 20 **A.** Yes.
- 21 Q. And so how would ... Would you see Lionel quite
- 22 frequently when you're ... You're still in the family home when

- 1 you were younger, and Shanna starts dating Lionel. Would you
- 2 see them together at your place quite often?
- 3 A. Yeah. Lionel was always down because my mother used
- 4 to be pretty sick, so Lionel used to come down and help with the
- 5 wood or, you know, help with the household, help her out.
- 6 Q. And how did ... Sort of in those early years while
- 7 you're still living at the family home and they're started out
- 8 sort of dating, how did Lionel get along with you and the rest
- 9 of the family?
- 10 A. Great. He joined our family with no hesitation, you
- 11 know, he was just a happy, cheerful guy. Lots of laughter,
- 12 dancing.
- 13 Q. And I heard a little bit from speaking to Sheldon that
- 14 Sheldon kind of almost looked at him sort of in the role of a
- 15 bit of a big brother at times.
- 16 **A.** Definitely. He was definitely like our big brother.
- 17 Q. And I wonder if you can tell me a little bit about
- 18 that in terms of what was that dynamic like?
- 19 A. Well, since I never had a big brother, it was
- 20 obviously nice to have him come around and help out. He used to
- 21 help with household chores or just take us some place. If we
- 22 needed to go somewhere, he would take us. You know, he was

- 1 really fun. You could talk to him about anything. Open-minded.
- 2 Q. Sort of, again, we're talking kind of pre-military.
- 3 They're just dating. In terms of your interactions and what you
- 4 saw in the relationship between Lionel and Shanna, how was it?
- 5 A. I thought it was pretty good. He was very quiet at
- 6 first. Like I didn't really know what was going on between them
- 7 except that he was coming over a lot. But, yeah, they seemed
- 8 like they were getting along very well at that point.
- 9 Q. Did you ever see sort of anything sort of unusual
- 10 about the relationship? I guess you know how you can sometimes
- 11 see a couple, that they're together but, look, they really don't
- 12 get along and they're constantly arguing. Did you sense any of
- 13 that when Shanna and Lionel are first sort of together and up to
- 14 when they got married?
- 15 A. No. I didn't see anything.
- 16 **Q.** Do you recall roughly when they did get married?
- 17 **A.** No, I don't.
- 18 Q. That's all right. So were they married, I quess,
- 19 before Lionel entered the military?
- 20 **A.** No. They got married after.
- 21 Q. Okay. And was it close in time?
- 22 **A.** I think it was when he came back. When he came back

- 1 maybe on his break. Or maybe before that. Not quite sure.
- 2 Q. Just to sort of help you along. We know Lionel had
- 3 started with the military in 2004, and we know that he went to
- 4 Afghanistan in 2007.
- 5 A. When Aaliyah was born. Yes. So they got married
- 6 before Aaliyah was born, I believe.
- 7 **Q.** Okay.
- 8 A. Yeah.
- 9 Q. So up to the point, I guess, when they got married,
- 10 was there anything that you noticed about the two of them as a
- 11 couple that would've caused you sort of any concern that, look,
- 12 they're not ... they don't appear to be getting along or how
- 13 would you describe their relationship overall?
- 14 A. So when they got back, originally, the wedding was
- 15 planned and everything was good but I know up ... when the
- 16 wedding happened, their first ... So they got married ... there
- 17 was two weddings, pretty much. The first one didn't go through
- 18 because he didn't show up because he was dealing with some
- 19 things. I'm not quite sure. And then I guess they went to the
- 20 justice of peace and got married a certain time later. So I'm
- 21 not really sure when that time was ... but, yeah.
- 22 Q. Were those two dates in the same year or do you think

- 1 they were separate years or ...
- 2 A. It was a separate year because the original one was a
- 3 date in January or December, so it was the following.
- 4 Q. The following year?
- 5 **A.** Yes.
- 6 Q. So, I guess, did you ever talk to Shanna a little bit
- 7 about that, what happened sort of in the first ... They were
- 8 set to get married. Was it sort of planned in terms of was
- 9 there like a church and reception and everything planned and
- 10 then it didn't happen?
- 11 A. Yeah. So everything was planned. Wedding dress,
- 12 everything. It was at St. FX. So her dress was there, guests
- 13 were coming in and then, you know, we were waiting. I know that
- 14 she was on the phone lots with him. I'm not quite sure, you
- 15 know, what was happening. I was still pretty young at the time.
- 16 And he didn't show up at that time, so she was left at the
- 17 altar.
- 18 Q. Roughly how old would you have been around that time
- 19 when they had the original date set?
- 20 **A.** I have a hard time remembering tomorrow.
- 21 **Q.** Me too.
- 22 A. Oh gosh. I was still in school.

- 1 Q. As in high school?
- 2 A. I would say ... Yeah, I was in high school, I
- 3 believe. I would say I was in Grade 9 maybe?
- 4 Q. So did you ever talk to Shanna then or in the years
- 5 later, or Lionel, about that, as to what really went on there?
- 6 What sort of ... what was the reasoning behind what was going
- 7 on?
- 8 A. All I know is that he was dealing with something. I'm
- 9 not quite sure. He didn't really know what he wanted to do. I
- 10 didn't really go into full detail because it wasn't the best
- 11 experience for her and I didn't want to really bring it up so
- 12 ...
- 13 Q. Mm-hmm. And up to sort of that point, from what you
- 14 saw, or by speaking to Shanna, how did the relationship seem?
- 15 **(13:20)**
- 16 A. It was good when they were together, like when it was
- 17 just him. When he had other people in his ear, then it was a
- 18 lot harder for them.
- 19 Q. Okay. And when you say "had other people in his ear,
- 20 it was a lot harder for them", what do you mean?
- 21 A. I just mean like family, different family members, you
- 22 know, maybe saying not to marry Shanna but, in the end, he just

- 1 ignored everyone and did what he wanted to do.
- 2 Q. Did you get a sense that there was a little bit of
- 3 pressure? Sort of maybe, you know, his family, I guess, didn't
- 4 want him marrying Shanna and then it sort of served as a bit of
- 5 a distraction? Did you get a sense of that?
- 6 A. Most definitely. Most definitely.
- 7 Q. And did you ever speak to Shanna about that?
- 8 A. I did. She knew that there was, you know, family
- 9 drama that was occurring, but then she also knew the way he felt
- 10 wholeheartedly as well, so when they talked and when they got
- 11 along, like I said, it was very good when it was just the two of
- 12 them, but when you have different family members coming in your
- 13 ear, it's a lot harder on you.
- 14 Q. Okay. And did Shanna ever talk about sort of whether
- 15 that was sort of a stressful or difficult thing to navigate for
- 16 the two of them?
- 17 **A.** It was. It was at first and then once Lionel's mother
- 18 started coming around things became so much better for them. Of
- 19 course, there was other family members that would, you know,
- 20 have something to say, but the most important one was his
- 21 mother, and once she approved, it was great. They all got along
- 22 really well.

- 1 Q. Okay. And I guess I'll ask you some questions that
- 2 actually may seem a little hard or probing a little bit. I'm
- 3 just trying to get an overall sense, as Judge Zimmer has
- 4 indicated, just sort of the dynamic and how you saw things.
- 5 So, again, we're talking sort of just up to the point where
- 6 they're married and earlier. Were there ever any sort of signs
- 7 of any sort of jealousy on either Shanna or Lionel's part?
- **A.** Early on in the marriage?
- 9 Q. Yeah. I guess ...
- 10 **A.** Or before?
- 11 Q. I guess up to ... We'll leave it for up to the point
- 12 where they get married, I guess. At that point and earlier, was
- 13 there any sort of jealousy aspects to the marriage and the
- 14 relationship?
- 15 **A.** No, I wouldn't say so. I wouldn't say. Not early on.
- 16 Q. And I guess we know that, later on, Lionel had
- 17 developed a fair number of sort of obsessive traits and it was
- 18 described as kind of being obsessed over finances and cleaning.
- 19 Did you ever see any of those early on in the relationship, I
- 20 guess up to the point where they first get married, or earlier?
- 21 A. Well, Lionel was always a clean freak. He always,
- 22 always, always loved cleaning, especially mopping and sweeping.

- 1 So I've noticed that.
- 2 Q. So I'm going to ask you a little bit about New
- 3 Brunswick. So when you graduate high school, do you immediately
- 4 go to New Brunswick afterwards?
- 5 **A.** Yes, I do.
- 6 Q. And you say Lionel and Shanna are living in New
- 7 Brunswick at that time.
- 8 A. Yeah, they were living in Oromocto in the PMQs.
- 9 Q. And you said "in Oromocto". What was the second part?
- 10 A. PMQs. So it's military housing.
- 11 Q. Okay. So they lived sort of in military housing. Was
- 12 that close to the military base?
- 13 A. Yeah. It was about ten minutes.
- 14 Q. So when you first moved there, who was living in their
- 15 household? Was it just the two of them?
- 16 A. Shanna, Lionel, and Aaliyah.
- 17 Q. And Aaliyah. Do you know how long you had lived with
- 18 them when you first left high school and you went to New
- 19 Brunswick?
- 20 A. I'd say about six months.
- 21 Q. Do you remember roughly what year that might've been?
- **A.** 2008.

- 1 **Q.** So ...
- 2 **A.** 2008/2009.
- 3 Q. So was it after Lionel had come back from Afghanistan?
- 4 **A.** Yes.
- 5 Q. So you lived with them. Were you sort of working or
- 6 in school at the time you were in New Brunswick?
- 7 A. I was working.
- 8 Q. So that dynamic, would you see them almost every day
- 9 in their place in New Brunswick?
- 10 **A.** Yes.
- 11 Q. How would you describe, sort of overall, what their
- 12 relationship was like? We'll talk about it generally and then
- 13 we'll get specific, but how was the relationship at that time,
- 14 in around 2008/2009, when you were living with them in New
- 15 Brunswick?
- 16 A. It was a normal relationship. You know, they would
- 17 have their little arguments here and there like anyone would but
- 18 it was nothing too drastic or out of the ordinary that I would
- 19 ... you know, that would make me question something.
- 20 Q. And I understand that your ex had been, at the time,
- 21 the relationship you had been in, he had been military as well?
- 22 A. Correct.

- 1 Q. And would he have been friends with Lionel?
- 2 A. He saw Lionel like around places but they weren't
- 3 exactly friends, no.
- 4 Q. So in terms of when you were living there ... How
- 5 long did you say you were living there? I might've missed that.
- 6 A. About six months.
- 7 O. About six months.
- 8 A. Living with them.
- 9 Q. With them, yes. So did you notice any sort of
- 10 arguments between them when you were there for those six months?
- 11 A. Yeah, there was arguments. Like I said, it wasn't
- 12 nothing that was out of the ordinary or made me nervous or
- 13 anything. Just regular boyfriend/girlfriend arguments.
- 14 Q. You kind of ... I know you probably didn't know all
- 15 the details, naturally, but what were the sort of things that
- 16 they would argue about?
- 17 A. Just him at work. Like he would come home talking
- 18 about someone at work. I had a new puppy that was staying with
- 19 them and they would argue about the puppy, you know, making
- 20 noise in the middle of the night or just something silly.
- 21 Q. And how long would sort of the conflict ... from what
- 22 you saw, would the conflict kind of last between them?

- 1 A. About 20 minutes. Nothing major.
- 2 Q. And in terms of Aaliyah, roughly how old would she
- 3 have been at that point?
- A. Oh. Aaliyah, I would say maybe one, two, maybe?
- 5 Q. Was Shanna ...
- 6 A. She was quite young.
- 7 Q. Was Shanna in school at that point?
- 8 **A.** No.
- 9 Q. No. So she had yet to sort of go into nursing.
- 10 A. Yeah. Yeah. She was still at home.
- 11 Q. In terms of their overall relationship, did anything
- 12 sort of stand out to you in that period of time you lived with
- 13 them in New Brunswick?
- 14 A. While living with them? No. Nothing stood out to me.
- 15 Q. Did you ever hear sort of Lionel talk about ... I
- 16 don't need to know the details, obviously, but we know a little
- 17 bit about after he came back from Afghanistan, that he was
- 18 struggling with a few things that he had experienced over there.
- 19 Did he ever sort of bring that home with him when you were
- 20 living there for those six months?
- 21 A. I know there was one time where he ... I think he
- 22 grabbed her by the throat like this was really early on

- 1 because he had a bad dream or something. You know, she calmed
- 2 him down, he woke up, and he was quite shaken up by it at that
- 3 time, but they talked it through. And I guess that was like the
- 4 first time that, you know, something was going on, but it wasn't
- 5 like a regular thing. He kind of got control of it at that
- 6 time.
- 7 Q. Was this during the period of time you had first lived
- 8 with them in New Brunswick?
- 9 A. Yeah. I would say it was about maybe four months in?
- 10 Four or five. Four-and-a-half months in, yeah.
- 11 Q. So you were living in the same house at the time that
- 12 this happened?
- 13 **A.** Yes.
- 14 Q. So I'm just going to ask you, and I know some of it
- 15 might be hard to talk about, but I'm just trying to get some
- 16 perspective on it. So you said he grabbed her by the throat.
- 17 What sort of context was that in? What do you recall from that?
- 18 A. Well, they were both sleeping, so it was in the middle
- 19 of the night. I guess he had a bad dream and he grabbed her by
- 20 the throat at this time to where she woke up and she was like,
- 21 you know, It's okay, It's just me, like, Lionel, Lionel, it's
- 22 just me, kind of thing. He kind of snapped out of it but when

- 1 he woke up, he was, you know, pretty sweaty. He had, you know,
- 2 a lot of sweat on him. He was soaking wet. So then I guess
- 3 they were up for a little bit for the rest of the night and then
- 4 he got up again. And I don't think he went to work that night
- 5 either ... that day. He was at home.
- 6 (13:30)
- 7 Q. Did you get any sense, after speaking to Lionel or
- 8 Shanna, what the dream was about?
- 9 A. All I know is that he was ... he dreamt that he was
- 10 back in Afghanistan. Like he doesn't really go into detail of
- 11 what he's experiencing over there, but he would just be like,
- 12 It's something that happened over there.
- 13 Q. And after sort of speaking with Lionel and Shanna, did
- 14 you get any sense as to whether ... was this sort of the first
- 15 time, did it happen before, was it something that was happening?
- 16 A. So this was the first time. It shocked her as well as
- 17 him; you know, especially if you're sleeping and someone
- 18 automatically grabs you in the throat. It's not something that
- 19 is a pleasant thing. But, you know, you can see in his eyes
- 20 that he was fearful about it. She wasn't so much because, you
- 21 know, she knew that he did experience some things over there,
- 22 but ... yeah.

- 1 Q. So did you ... is this something that when it
- 2 happened, you were alerted to it that night or was it the next
- 3 morning? Do you remember?
- 4 A. It was that night ... well, that morning.
- 5 **Q.** Yeah.
- A. Not that night; morning.
- 7 Q. So ... and you interacted with Lionel that next
- 8 morning.
- 9 **A.** Yeah.
- 10 Q. What do you recall? Like how did he feel about what
- 11 happened the night before? Do you recall what he was saying or
- 12 how he would talk?
- 13 **A.** So the night before it happened?
- 14 **Q.** Or the night ...
- 15 A. He was fine.
- 16 **o.** So ...
- 17 A. The night after.
- 18 Q. After, the next morning. So ...
- 19 **A.** Okay.
- 20 Q. It happens and ...
- 21 A. So he didn't originally tell me. It was Shanna that
- 22 told me. I tried to talk to him about it a little bit and he's

- 1 just like, I had a bad dream, like I don't want to talk about
- 2 it, kind of thing. And then I guess he stepped outside and
- 3 Shanna told me what happened. And then I guess I questioned him
- 4 about it ... you know, a little bit later on that day. He'd
- 5 just be like, I'm sorry. Like, you know, I had a bad dream. I
- 6 don't know what happened, kind of thing. But, he's like, I'll
- 7 get it together. So ...
- 8 Q. Did you get any sense of ... did you ever discuss with
- 9 Shanna or Lionel whether this occurred again ... any incidents
- 10 like that happened afterwards?
- 11 A. I was never notified that anything happened. I heard
- 12 that something happened from my mom but they never told me
- 13 anything about it.
- 14 Q. This was another incident, you mean.
- 15 **A.** Yeah.
- 16 Q. I know ... if I could just have one moment. I know,
- 17 Your Honour, this is really getting into sort of hearsay and I
- 18 know that it is a provincial court obviously and ...
- 19 **THE COURT:** Ask.
- 20 Q. Thank you, Your Honour. So what was the other
- 21 circumstances in terms of your mother alerted you to something
- 22 else? What was the ...

- 1 A. Well, I guess he did grab her by the throat again
- 2 another time when they were sleeping but this happened at my
- 3 mother's house. So it didn't happen in New Brunswick. It was,
- 4 you know, a couple of years later that it happened again. And I
- 5 guess his dreams or his hallucinations were occurring more
- 6 frequently.
- 7 Q. Okay. And did you get a sense as to whether or not
- 8 ... did you talk to Shanna about what she was thinking about it
- 9 and how she felt about it?
- 10 A. She just said that, you know, he suffered from PTSD
- 11 and that he needs treatment, he needs help, kind of thing. She
- 12 was very adamant that he needed help and he was as well. But,
- 13 you know, I guess it was very hard for them to figure out where
- 14 to go at that point in time on what to do.
- 15 Q. And when you say it was hard for them to figure out
- 16 ... and you said this is a few years later, hard for them to
- 17 figure out where to go and what to do, what do you mean by that?
- 18 A. As in like there's not a lot of resources for mental
- 19 health, especially when you're out of the military. Getting a
- 20 hold of Veterans Affairs is quite a struggle. And then having
- 21 to deal with, you know, military doctors and then transforming
- 22 to civilian doctors, medical records; you know, all that. All

- 1 those documents is ... it's ... you get the kind of go-arounds.
- 2 Q. Well, I just want to keep it confined to your
- 3 conversations with Shanna and Lionel and their trying to
- 4 navigate through this. Did they ever express to you concerns
- 5 they had about ... directly to you about whether or not they
- 6 were having a hard time sort of trying to navigate where to go?
- 7 A. Yes. I was present when Shanna was on the phone
- 8 multiple times, you know, trying to get a hold of someone on
- 9 what to do but it was difficult.
- 10 Q. All right. In terms of that period of time in New
- 11 Brunswick and sort of before then, did you ever notice if Lionel
- 12 ... we know a little bit about at times he would lean on
- 13 alcohol. But did it appear as though he had any issues with
- 14 alcohol before Afghanistan or just as he came back?
- 15 A. No. I don't really think that it was a problem. I
- 16 mean, you know, he would have a beer here and there but ...
- 17 Q. So you're there for six months in New Brunswick and
- 18 then you made reference to they go and live with you in New
- 19 Brunswick at some point?
- 20 A. Yes. I bought a house about five minutes ... not even
- 21 five minutes from them and they came to live with me.
- 22 Q. And when ... how soon after was it that they went and

- 1 lived with you after you left? So you were with them for six
- 2 months. Then you leave and you get a house and they're living
- 3 with you. How much sort of time passes?
- 4 A. It wasn't a lot of time. It was, I would say, maybe
- 5 four months after I bought the house.
- 6 Q. Do you remember how long they would have lived with
- 7 you in the same house?
- 8 A. They lived with me for about a year.
- 9 Q. So at that point where they're living with you for
- 10 about a year is Shanna in school at this point? Do you
- 11 remember?
- 12 A. No. She is working. She'd be working.
- 13 Q. Okay. And was Lionel still in the military at that
- 14 point?
- 15 **A.** Yes.
- 16 Q. So I'm wondering if you could tell me a little bit
- 17 about sort of the dynamics. So who's living in your house at
- 18 that point? We know Lionel, Shanna. I'm assuming Aaliyah is
- 19 there, as well?
- 20 A. Yes. So Lionel, Shanna, Aaliyah, and then it would be
- 21 my ex, Navneet, that was living with us.
- 22 Q. What do you7 notice about their ... and they're ...

- 1 are they married at this point?
- 2 **A.** Yes.
- 3 Q. What, if anything, you can tell us about how they were
- 4 getting along in that year that they went to live with you in
- 5 New Brunswick?
- 6 A. They got along pretty well. They mostly stayed in the
- 7 basement because I had an ensuite. But it was really good. You
- 8 know, they were living with me because they were trying to buy
- 9 their own house. So they were pretty excited about that, lots
- 10 of shopping, lots of talks about how they were going to
- 11 decorate, whatnot. And I think that's when he also bought his
- 12 Jeep as well.
- 13 Q. Did you notice any ...
- 14 A. So they were doing pretty well.
- 15 Q. Did you notice any sort of arguments between them
- 16 during this year that they're living with you?
- 17 A. Yeah, there was arguments. Nothing out of the
- 18 ordinary just basic simple arguments like I would have with my
- 19 ex.
- 20 Q. Okay. Sure. But, in your mind, sort of nothing
- 21 unusual or concerning?
- 22 A. No, nothing unusual. Nothing out of the ordinary.

- 1 Q. And did Lionel ever sort of ... did you ever get a
- 2 sense of how he was coping and dealing with coming back from
- 3 Afghanistan? So now we're in about 2010, I guess, if I'm doing
- 4 the math correctly.
- 5 **A.** Yeah.
- 6 Q. How he's doing?
- 7 A. So he would have his days. I know that things were
- 8 getting a little bit worse for him as he was going to work. I
- 9 know he was dealing with a lot of problems with his buddies or
- 10 people that was on his platoon. So he'd come back and, you
- 11 know, talk to my ex about it, since they were in the same
- 12 platoon. But it was nothing towards Shanna. It was moreso he
- 13 was having issues at work, kind of thing.
- 14 Q. And I wonder if you could tell us a little bit about
- 15 what he would sort of come back home and convey to you about the
- 16 problems he was having at work with the platoon. What sort of
- 17 problems was he having?
- 18 **(13:40)**
- 19 **A.** He was just ... he went into ... so they took him out
- 20 of the group that he was in and they put him into the band, so
- 21 Pipes and Drums. He wasn't very happy that he was going into it
- 22 at first. He thought pretty much that they were demoting him.

- 1 But then after he started going in, he started making, you know,
- 2 a little bit more friends, buddies in the band and Pipes and
- 3 Drums, he enjoyed it a little bit more. He got to travel. Like
- 4 he went to Halifax a couple of times for the Tattoo. So
- 5 eventually he started to like it.
- 6 Q. Did he ever talk to you or were you ever present when
- 7 he talked to someone in the home about any conflicts he might
- 8 have had with people on his platoon?
- 9 A. Yeah. So there was ... it was moreso ... he said it
- 10 was moreso about racism. He said that there's a lot of them
- 11 that were racist. He didn't really go into full detail about
- 12 what was happening. He moreso talked to my ex about it. But he
- 13 just said a lot of them were racist so ...
- 14 Q. And were you ever present for the conversations he was
- 15 having with your ex as in like the same room or ...
- 16 A. Yes, but I can't really remember exactly what was
- 17 being said in their military lingo.
- 18 Q. You indicated ... you said he was talking about
- 19 experiencing racism while he was in, say, the platoon there and
- 20 he was in the band. Did he give sort of examples of what it was
- 21 he was going through?
- 22 **A.** I guess they were just like little small remarks that

- 1 people would say. Like I guess one time he was drinking ... he
- 2 did say this. One time he was drinking chocolate milk, which he
- 3 loves, and one person got on his case for drinking chocolate
- 4 milk and not drinking white milk. And they said, Well, you
- 5 don't like white milk or something? And I guess they were
- 6 putting it into a racist context to him to where at that point
- 7 he got pretty mad and they got into an argument. And I guess he
- 8 chased the person around the table, he was so upset at that
- 9 point in time, to where his commanding officers pretty much told
- 10 him to go home.
- 11 Q. Did you get a sense of how frequent those experiences
- 12 were for him in terms of being subjected to some racism or
- 13 whether its comments directly or sort of innuendos? Did you get
- 14 a sense of how persistent that seemed to be with him? Like how
- often was he complaining about that? I shouldn't say
- 16 "complaining". How often was he telling you about that
- 17 experience?
- 18 A. It was slow at first. Like he would say something
- 19 here and there but then later on it started to get more frequent
- 20 with him. And then my ex, as well, used to come home and say
- 21 pretty much the same exact stories of how people were racist
- 22 and, you know, making them do, as they would say, the "grunt"

- 1 work instead of doing the work that they're trained to be doing
- 2 so ...
- 3 Q. And did you see whether or not this appeared to have
- 4 sort of an impact on Lionel, how he was when he'd come back and
- 5 he'd be telling you about this? Did it seem to have an effect
- 6 on him, like an impact on him?
- 7 A. Most definitely. He was quite upset. You know, you
- 8 go somewhere and risk your life for your country and, you know,
- 9 you spend all that time over in another country and then to come
- 10 home and to have to deal with racism, especially from the ones
- 11 that maybe you're over there fighting with or fighting for. It
- 12 took a major impact on him.
- 13 Q. In terms of discussing with you what it was he
- 14 experienced, what were his views of sort of ... at that point
- 15 when this was happening, what were his views of being in the
- 16 military? How did he feel about being in the military?
- 17 A. He didn't like it. He wanted to get out. But he
- 18 wasn't quite sure at that ... at this point, he wasn't quite
- 19 sure on what he wanted to do because being in the military is
- 20 something that he really enjoyed and it's something that he
- 21 really did love to do. But, you know, if you go to work and the
- 22 people that you are working with isn't making work good for you,

- 1 then it kind of ruins your spirit for it.
- 2 Q. So you got a sense, I guess, of ... at this period of
- 3 time, in around 2010 when he's living with you, I guess if you
- 4 could sum up generally how he was feeling about his employment
- 5 at that time, what would you say?
- 6 A. He hated it.
- 7 Q. Did you notice whether or not this was causing any
- 8 stress or tension in the dynamic with Shanna in their
- 9 relationship?
- 10 A. It was, because she doesn't really understand what was
- 11 going on at work either. It's not like we experience racism
- 12 firsthand, really, especially down home in Guysborough. But,
- 13 you know, when you come home and you're always getting
- 14 complaints about what's happening at work ... even for myself,
- 15 my ex would just say that they're all just racist. So dealing
- 16 with that and having to calm someone down and be like, Okay,
- 17 well, you're home now. Like leave work at work and come back
- 18 home and let's deal with our stuff. But it was hard to find the
- 19 balance between that.
- 20 Q. And would you see sort of incidents where Shanna would
- 21 try to, I guess, get him to sort of diffuse a little bit, try
- 22 to, You're home now, let it go. Would you see examples of that?

- 1 A. I did. Sometimes, you know, it would work and then,
- 2 other times, she'd be like, Okay, Shonda, let's go. We're going
- 3 for a drive. And then we'll leave and we'll go to the mall, go
- 4 shopping or go walk around the marina that was right below our
- 5 house.
- Q. And when you would come back, how would he seem?
- 7 A. He was fine.
- 8 **Q.** Okay.
- 9 A. The switch turned off.
- 10 Q. All right. Was this sort of ... how frequent, I guess
- 11 ... I'm trying to get a sense of how frequent during this period
- of time that he would come home, he would be bothered, he would
- 13 be sort of unloading the bad things that he had experienced, and
- 14 then it would cause a little bit of tension and Shanna would try
- 15 to speak to him and then leaving? How frequent would that have
- 16 been?
- 17 A. So I would say about maybe six times a month.
- 18 Q. Okay. So six times a month, if I'm doing the math and
- 19 seeing four months in a week, it was sometimes more than one a
- 20 week?
- 21 A. Yeah. Yeah.
- 22 Q. Had they discussed ... or did they discuss with you

- 1 any sort of idea that he was going to then try to get out of the
- 2 military?
- 3 A. So later on, he did ... we knew that he did want to go
- 4 out. Again, he just didn't know what ... like he was very
- 5 focused on he wanted to be an RCMP officer. Like that's what he
- 6 wanted to do. But, of course, when he got diagnosed with the
- 7 PTSD, he knew that that probably wasn't the best choice for him.
- 8 And then he started working on cars a lot more frequently,
- 9 especially his own. And he would learn things from either my
- 10 father or watching YouTube videos. And that's what he'd really
- 11 put his time and energy into. That's something that calmed him
- 12 down like a lot was working on the vehicles.
- 13 Q. And I know it may seem by my questions that I'm
- 14 dwelling on the negative. In terms of Lionel's sort of skill-
- 15 set, what sort of characteristics or qualities did he have that
- 16 were sort of very good in terms of his abilities?
- 17 A. He was good at shooting. No. He was very ... his
- 18 abilities and qualities. He was really good at learning things
- 19 firsthand. Like I said, he would watch YouTube videos maybe
- 20 once and he'll go and change the brakes on his car for the first
- 21 time, or he'd watch my dad do something, he would get it right
- 22 away, so his mindset was pretty good that way.

- 1 Q. In those early years in terms of when Aaliyah was
- 2 first born ... I guess in general throughout the period of time
- 3 Aaliyah is born and as she's getting older, how was he ... that
- 4 you saw, how was he as a dad?
- 5 A. As a dad, he was very fun. He was a jokester. You
- 6 know, he loved to laugh and joke around and dance and make funny
- 7 faces. He was really good with Aaliyah.
- 8 Q. And they got along well?
- 9 A. They did. Yes.
- 10 Q. When we spoke before, you gave a sort of a sense of
- 11 Shanna is close to you and then Lionel was close to you, as
- 12 well.
- 13 **A.** Yeah.
- 14 Q. Would they often ... how often would they confide in
- 15 you, and this isn't necessarily limited to this period of time
- 16 in New Brunswick, but how often would they sort of confide in
- 17 you if they had an argument? Did they ever reach out to you?
- 18 A. Pretty much all the time.
- 19 **(13:50)**
- 20 Q. Do you know how that sort of developed, how you became
- 21 the person they would reach out to if they weren't getting along
- 22 or having an argument?

- 1 A. I'm not sure. I was just really adamant about ... I
- 2 mean I knew that he was going through things, but I was very
- 3 adamant about her, you know, sticking through him through
- 4 sickness and health kind of thing and I used to say that, you
- 5 know, quite often. Like, you know, he's sick, but you married
- 6 him. You got to deal with it, kind of thing, and ... I don't
- 7 know. It's like I was the big sister in that sense.
- 8 Q. Okay. And so I guess from 2010 all the way up to,
- 9 say, January of 2017, did you get a sense of whether or not ...
- 10 if their marriage became more or less of a struggle?
- 11 A. Oh, yeah, it definitely became a struggle, especially
- 12 in the end because things got a lot worse. It was a lot harder
- 13 to deal with at that time, so ... yeah.
- 14 Q. I'm going to ask you a little bit about that
- 15 momentarily but in terms of 2010 ... so where did they go after
- 16 that year they're living with you and then where do you go?
- 17 A. So they ended up buying their own house, which was
- 18 like ten minutes from my house. Oromocto is quite small. So
- 19 they bought their house and I was still at my house at that
- 20 time.
- 21 Q. And would you see them as often when they were still
- 22 in New Brunswick in their own place as you were in yours?

- 1 A. Yeah. We saw each other pretty much every day. Me
- 2 and Shanna used to walk every day ... every morning, so ...
- 3 Q. Okay. And how ... I guess if you can tell me a little
- 4 bit about how often they would reach out to you, sort of from
- 5 that point on, if there was a conflict. How often would you
- 6 hear from them? Not just sort of, Hey, Shonda, how's it going;
- 7 Went for groceries today, versus, Oh, here we go again. There's
- 8 some sort of conflict in the relationship. How often were they
- 9 reaching out to you?
- 10 A. Pretty much every time something happened.
- 11 Q. Are you able to say how frequent that was?
- 12 A. Oh, man! Well, earlier on ... so when they first got
- 13 their place, it wasn't ... it wasn't excessive. I'd say maybe
- 14 twice a month. And then later on it became multiple times a
- 15 month.
- 16 Q. And how would they reach out to you? Would it be by
- 17 phone or ...
- 18 A. Either phone or text.
- 19 Q. So would you ... would they ... did it seem as though
- 20 they would contact you soon after a disagreement or days later
- 21 or sometimes both? I'm just trying to get a sense of how long
- 22 would pass (inaudible audio).

- 1 A. It was usually when it was happening. So Shanna would
- 2 either call me or text me and she'd be like, Shonda, contact
- 3 your patient. So then I would contact Lionel or Lionel would
- 4 end up calling me when she texted me and we would just talk like
- 5 through things.
- 6 Q. So sometimes Shanna would get the message to you about
- 7 the conflict and then she would ask you to contact Lionel?
- 8 **A.** Yes.
- 9 Q. So I'm trying to get a sense of how did that sort of
- 10 develop. Like what ... you know.
- 11 A. I don't know. I think that she just knew that me and
- 12 Lionel were very close. Like Lionel was like my best friend
- 13 pretty much. So any time that he was frustrated, he would just
- 14 contact me. I don't know why. He just did.
- 15 Q. So if you could tell me sort of the ... was there a
- 16 time ... we have sort of a series of years, that's 2010 and then
- 17 after 2010 when they sort of get their own place in New
- 18 Brunswick, and we have 2016 which is sort of the last Christmas
- 19 together. Did you get a sense of when things started to become
- 20 more frequent in terms of their not getting along or ...
- 21 A. So obviously they ... when they got to their place,
- 22 you know, obviously they would have their arguments and whatnot.

- 1 And then I would say around 2012 to 2013 is when things started
- 2 to get really rocky. Like there was arguments a lot more
- 3 frequently than before.
- 4 Q. Can you sort of give me an example of ... you would
- 5 hear from Shanna and you would hear from Lionel, sometimes both
- 6 I guess, sometimes one or the other. What were the arguments
- 7 over?
- 8 A. It was really small stuff, either like not loading the
- 9 dishes into the dishwasher properly or, you know, not cleaning
- 10 the house properly or ... just basic things that were like
- 11 really petty, I should say. And then like I said, like in 2013
- 12 on, it was getting a lot ... little bit more intense where it
- 13 was coming into finances. And then she was in school then so,
- 14 you know, school things and driving back and forth, military
- 15 problems. Yeah, everything.
- 16 Q. Did you ... so what were the concerns ... like what
- 17 was the ... if they had an argument about her school, what was
- 18 the argument about? Do you remember?
- 19 A. Like finances, I would believe, moreso finances.
- 20 Like, you know, spending lots of money into school. Like, You
- 21 better finish this; like, you know, This is a lot of money; you
- 22 know, you better be making ... passing grades, kind of thing, or

- 1 just driving back and forth from New Brunswick to Nova Scotia.
- 2 Q. And what was it that driving back and forth that was
- 3 the source of the conflict?
- 4 A. Because she would leave him. Like, obviously, he had
- 5 to stay there because he was still at work and then she had to
- 6 leave him to go to Nova Scotia, so ... he just ... he didn't
- 7 really like to be alone either.
- 8 Q. What was it about ... sort of did you get a sense what
- 9 was it about being alone that he didn't like?
- 10 A. I don't know if he just really loved his family or if
- 11 he was just really lonely but he didn't enjoy being alone.
- 12 Q. In terms of ... even after you moved to Saskatchewan,
- 13 do they both sort of continue to reach out to you whenever there
- 14 was a conflict or an argument?
- 15 A. Yes, they did.
- 16 Q. And I know there's a time difference. There's a
- 17 three-hour time difference. Was there ... was it unique to the
- 18 daytime, nighttime, morning when they'd reach out to you?
- 19 A. To me, it was either really early in the morning or it
- 20 was coming onto late in the evening.
- 21 Q. So towards the end of, I guess, if we go 2015 2016,
- 22 the last sort of two years, how frequent would you hear from the

- 1 two of them or one of them in terms of, There was an argument
- 2 and can you talk to one of us about it?
- 3 A. So at this point it was moreso Lionel contacting me
- 4 and then I would contact Shanna just to figure out what was
- 5 going on, to hear her side. So Lionel ... so '15 '16, it was
- 6 quite often. He would either message me on Facebook or call me
- 7 or text me. So it was quite a bit, maybe sometimes two times a
- 8 week.
- 9 Q. And what were the sort of ...
- 10 A. Two or three times a week.
- 11 Q. And what were the sort of things that he was telling
- 12 you about that was a problem within the marriage? What was he
- 13 complaining about?
- 14 A. If Shanna left to go somewhere and she took Aaliyah,
- 15 he would be wondering where she was; you know, what she was
- 16 doing, that she was leaving him or ... I know they made plans to
- 17 come out here more ... like so they came out here and then they
- 18 went back and they were planning on coming back out here the
- 19 following March. He was worried that she was going to come out
- 20 here by herself and not bring him and not tell him or she was
- 21 going to finish school and come out here and move without him,
- 22 just ... yeah.

- 1 Q. So you're described sort of three different scenarios
- 2 there. One you described, she would just leave with Aaliyah and
- 3 then he would call you concerned that she just left with
- 4 Aaliyah?
- 5 A. Yeah. So they would make plans. Because I know one
- 6 incident they made plans to find this certain game, board game.
- 7 And they talked about it. They were in Halifax one time looking
- 8 for it and they couldn't find it. And they asked me to look for
- 9 it out West, but it was sold out.
- 10 (14:00)
- 11 Q. This is a kid's game?
- 12 A. So Shanna made plans to go ...
- 13 **Q.** This is ...
- 14 A. It was an adult-kid game. It was like this game that
- 15 you would put like this dentist thing in your mouth ...
- 16 **Q.** Okay.
- 17 A. ... and just like try to talk, you know. Silly game,
- 18 family game. So finally Shanna found it so they had to go to
- 19 Halifax to go get it. So her and Aaliyah and Brenda went to
- 20 Halifax and Lionel freaked out. He forgot that they were going
- 21 up to Halifax to get the game but in his mind, you know, she was
- 22 leaving him. But it was just ... he took it way out of

- 1 proportion.
- 2 Q. So did he know ... was it a scenario where he just
- 3 sort of woke up and they were gone or did you get a sense that
- 4 he knew they were going to Halifax to buy the game?
- 5 A. He originally knew, but like once I told him, Hey,
- 6 they went to Halifax to get the game, they're coming back, it
- 7 was like he just didn't want to listen. He was like, No,
- 8 they're leaving me, you know, they're not coming back. She's
- 9 taking Aaliyah from me. No, he went to worst-case scenario.
- 10 Q. And did you ever talk to Shanna about sort of an
- 11 incident like that?
- 12 A. Yeah, I was talking to her that day as well.
- 13 Q. And what was she ...
- 14 A. She's just like, He's crazy. Like he's crazy.
- 15 Q. Did you get a sense that there was any sort of lead-up
- 16 to this? Was there an argument or it was just as innocent as
- 17 she's going to buy the game, you know she's going to buy the
- 18 game and suddenly he feels that she's leaving?
- 19 A. Yeah, like they were totally fine, she said that, you
- 20 know, before everything happened. I guess he went somewhere so
- 21 she left in the morning and then he just went 360, I guess.
- 22 Q. And when he's contacting you, how does he seem? Does

- 1 he seem convinced that she's actually leaving him?
- 2 A. Oh yeah. Oh yeah, he was very agitated and then
- 3 eventually, you know, I got him to calm down. I was like, Yo,
- 4 you know, she's just gone to Halifax, calm down kind of thing.
- 5 Like she's going to be back. But, yeah, he was very adamant
- 6 that she was leaving him and taking Aaliyah with her.
- 7 Q. How ... did you get a sense of how often those sort of
- 8 occurrences would happen, that you would hear about either from
- 9 him or from Shanna where she would sort of just almost
- 10 innocently go somewhere and then he would equate it to her
- 11 leaving?
- 12 A. It started happening more often. Yeah, it started
- 13 happening a lot more often than obviously before, like before he
- 14 wouldn't have a care in the world and then, you know, leading up
- 15 to the end of their lives it got a whole lot worse. Like his
- 16 ... I don't ... I don't know.
- 17 Q. Could you get a sense of, and I know at the time
- 18 you're certainly not marking this down, but those occurrences
- 19 where he believed that she was leaving him when she would just
- 20 sort of innocently leave and you said that it happened later.
- 21 So did it happen sort of before 2015/2016? So if we ...
- 22 A. I think it was ... no, it was around that time, like

- 1 ... yeah, 2015 I would say.
- Q. Were you in Saskatchewan at that time?
- 3 **A.** Yes.
- 4 Q. Can you think of any other sort of examples of ... you
- 5 were able to recall the one where she sent for the game. Do you
- 6 remember any other specific sort of examples that were similar
- 7 to that?
- 8 A. Gosh, you're putting me on the spot now.
- 9 Q. Take your time. Take your time.
- 10 A. Yeah, I don't know. I don't know, my mind is blank at
- 11 the moment.
- 12 Q. What about sort of in a scenario, was there ever
- 13 anything ever similar to you talked about when she would go to
- 14 school she would drive. I believe she went to school in
- 15 Antigonish?
- 16 A. Yes, she went to St. FX.
- 17 Q. So did he ever express his views or did Shanna ever
- 18 express her views as to how he was feeling about that? Did he
- 19 have similar concerns there?
- 20 A. Well, in the beginning he was totally fine with it,
- 21 you know. He said just make the good marks kind of thing, and
- 22 then when she started going back and forth or when she started

- 1 doing her practicums, which were obviously were there and she
- 2 started staying a lot more of her time down home, pretty much
- 3 living there. And the plan was obviously to sell the house and
- 4 then move, you know, to my mom's house and then buy a house
- 5 there. So he was just very, I don't know, lonely in New
- 6 Brunswick, which then that made him want to get out of the
- 7 military even faster because he wasn't with his family. So,
- 8 yeah.
- 9 Q. Did he have the same ... did he ever express any
- 10 similar sort of views that, Look, she's at school but he
- 11 believed she might have been somewhere else?
- 12 A. Yeah, he used to think that she was off with someone
- 13 else or seeing somebody else when she would go to school. Or if
- 14 she was late or doing night shifts, you know, for practicum or
- 15 whatnot, he used to believe that she was with somebody else when
- 16 realistically she was at her job.
- 17 Q. And did he ever kind of talk to you about that sort of
- 18 believing that even though she was off doing her practicum or at
- 19 school, he believed she was with someone else? Did he ever sort
- 20 of elaborate on that?
- 21 A. He would try to but then I basically cut him off and
- 22 just be like, Don't be so crazy kind of thing. You know, she's

- 1 at school. You know, she's doing this for all of you and not
- 2 just, you know, for her, but ...
- 3 Q. And how did he seem to react to that when you were
- 4 trying to bring him back to, Look, she's at school?
- 5 A. Sometimes it would go really well and then other times
- 6 it would be like, No, I know, you know. He would say, I know
- 7 what's in my head, you know, it's not ... it's not true, but
- 8 it's like I can't shake it sometimes, you know, these are my
- 9 thoughts, you know, and it's hard not to shake it. But at this
- 10 point I would just be like, Well, you're being crazy kind of
- 11 thing. It's not a good word to say but it's like ...
- 12 **Q.** Yes.
- 13 A. You are being crazy because ...
- 14 **Q.** Yes.
- 15 A. That wasn't her. You know, it wasn't her character.
- 16 Q. So did this sort of ... did this seem sort of a
- 17 frequent sort of occurrence where he would believe that she's
- 18 either leaving him or that she's going with someone else? Did
- 19 you get a sense of how frequent ...
- 20 A. Yeah, it started happening a lot more frequently in
- 21 the end. It wasn't just, you know, finances or cleaning the
- 22 wrong way, it was like, You're doing something behind my back.

- 1 You're doing something against me kind of thing so ...
- 2 Q. Did Shanna ever talk to you about that, how she
- 3 perceived it and how she felt about it?
- 4 A. It was driving her crazy. I'd say it would drive
- 5 anyone crazy to be accused of something knowing that you're not
- 6 doing anything but she dealt with it in her own way I guess.
- 7 Q. And you described ... so that was sort of the first
- 8 sort of examples. You gave another example, I'm trying to
- 9 recall. I'm trying to recall my question and your answer. I'll
- 10 go back to it. But what other sort of things that he would call
- 11 you about that he was concerned with?
- 12 A. Oh my gosh, I don't know. So there was school, there
- 13 was finances, there was the car. So they had a car as well.
- 14 Sometimes he would get a little mad because Lionel could not
- 15 drive a standard very well so he would get annoyed. You know,
- 16 he got mad over something he would take her car even though he
- 17 couldn't drive a standard. He'd be revving the gears or ruining
- 18 the clutch kind of thing. So then she would get mad at him,
- 19 then he would get mad at her and it was just really petty things
- 20 at times.
- 21 Q. So did you get the sense that he would sort of
- 22 deliberately ... sort of they'd have an argument, he'd get angry

- 1 and then he would go sort of rev her car?
- 2 A. Yeah, because ... well, he would take the car away
- 3 from her at times. So when he used to get mad he'd be like,
- 4 Well, you know, I bought this car and I'm taking it kind of
- 5 thing. So he would just do little spiteful things just to try
- 6 to make her life a little bit more difficult. Eventually he
- 7 would come around and be like, I'm sorry, Pookie, which is what
- 8 he used to call her. Yeah.
- 9 Q. Did you get a sense of how frequent that sort of was?
- 10 You said he would do little spiteful things like taking her car,
- 11 like how often would that sort of happen?
- 12 (14:10)
- 13 A. Quite regular. If it wasn't the car then he would
- 14 change the finances, like change the banking information. I
- 15 know that one time ... Shanna was the one who did all the
- 16 banking pretty much, you know, so then when he did that then he
- 17 was responsible to do all the banking and then, you know, there
- 18 would be cell phone bills that weren't paid and the phone would
- 19 get cut off. And then she would contact me and she'd be like,
- 20 Well, Lionel didn't pay any of the phone bills, like his is cut
- 21 off and mine is cut off, can you ... and then I would hook them
- 22 back up or whatever for them. But it was like little spiteful

- 1 things that he would do like that.
- 2 Q. And at some point she ... I believe if we fast forward
- 3 I guess for a brief moment, in 2016 she might have got a new
- 4 truck?
- 5 A. Yes, so she got a new truck.
- 6 Q. And did he ever express to you or did she ever express
- 7 to you his views on the fact that she got a new truck?
- 8 A. Realistically he was jealous because he did want a
- 9 truck. A truck is something that he'd always wanted. But
- 10 Shanna knew that she couldn't rely ... at this point she knew
- 11 that she couldn't rely on him for the car that she had so then
- 12 she had to go out and get her own truck, which my mom and dad
- 13 helped her with the down payment for.
- 14 Q. What sort of made you say "I believe that he was
- 15 jealous over the fact that she had a new truck"? Clearly there
- 16 must have been something that would suggest that to you. What
- 17 was it?
- 18 A. Yeah, well, it's something that he wanted but also to
- 19 the fact where he didn't have control over her having a vehicle
- 20 on being able to get to work with his vehicle is pretty much
- 21 because he had his Jeep and then he also paid for the car as
- 22 well, so those were in his name. But when she got the truck he

- 1 was like, Oh well, my name is not on that kind of thing, so I'm
- 2 jealous that you have that, you could get that without me kind
- 3 of thing.
- 4 Q. When you say before he would take the car, do you know
- 5 how he would go about taking the car? Would he physically move
- 6 it or would he take the keys or disassemble it? How was he
- 7 taking the car from her?
- 8 A. Well, he would take ... actually drive it out the
- 9 driveway or he would take the keys, one or the other.
- 10 Q. And did you get a sense of how long he would sort of
- 11 keep the access to the car away from her?
- 12 A. Well, sometimes it would be for a month.
- 13 **Q.** About a month?
- 14 A. Sometimes, yeah.
- 15 Q. So how would she get around, I guess, if she didn't
- 16 have a car sometimes a month?
- 17 A. She would use my mom or my dad's vehicles.
- 18 Q. So this ... just to get this straight. So it would be
- 19 a car that she would normally drive. Would she drive this car
- 20 to school?
- 21 A. Yeah. So the car was bought for her. You know, he
- 22 had his Jeep and then she had the car. The car was bought for

- 1 her. And if they had an argument or, you know, he was feeling
- 2 some type of way then he would take that from her. Yeah.
- 3 Q. Would she ever talk to you about that? Say, Look,
- 4 he's taken the car from me for a month?
- 5 A. Well, she wouldn't say a month, it would be like ...
- 6 **Q.** Yeah.
- 7 A. ... well, he took the car. It would be like, Yeah, he
- 8 took the car away from me again. Like he got the keys. And she
- 9 wouldn't beg him for anything. So if he came back then he came
- 10 back on his own accord, you know, she was ... she wasn't someone
- 11 who was going to kiss someone's behind for something. She was
- 12 very independent and she knew that whatever happened she was
- 13 going to be able to finish school regardless.
- 14 Q. And I guess at that point Aaliyah is born, so how
- 15 would she sort of get Aaliyah around with no car?
- 16 A. Relying on Mom and Dad.
- 17 Q. And so your parents gave her their car?
- 18 A. A vehicle to use, yeah.
- 19 Q. Okay. Did you get a sense from him what he thought of
- 20 that?
- 21 **A.** Umm ...
- 22 Q. Did he ever express to you?

- 1 A. I didn't really think that he cared. As long as that
- 2 he wasn't involved or he didn't pay for it kind of thing then he
- 3 didn't really have a care in the world. I think that he knew
- 4 that regardless whatever he did that she was going to have some
- 5 type of backup plan.
- 6 Q. And you said earlier, you talked about when it came to
- 7 her school, that you said he said something to the effect of
- 8 well, you'd better pass or you'd better do well. Did he ever
- 9 convey that information to you?
- 10 A. It wasn't specifically to me, but like they would have
- 11 discussions like, say, in the kitchen or in the living room.
- 12 And he'd be like, You better be passing, you know, these grades
- 13 kind of thing. You know, spend all this money and ... or
- 14 especially like around tax time, tax time is normally when she
- 15 would end up putting more money on for school so ...
- 16 Q. What did he ... did he ever express what his thoughts
- 17 were just on the fact that she was going back to school and she
- 18 was going to become a professional nurse? Did he ever tell you
- 19 sort of what he thought about that or did she ever tell you what
- 20 he thought ... what he was saying about it?
- 21 A. Yeah. Well, originally he was very excited for her
- 22 and very happy and then in the end I think he was ... I don't

- 1 know, I don't really like to use the word jealous, but I think
- 2 that he was jealous or I would say lost, because he was now out
- 3 of the military, pretty much retired, and they didn't know what
- 4 to do. So now you go from being the sole provider for your
- 5 family to now where she's going to be making the money and being
- 6 the sole provider so ... yeah.
- 7 Q. You described one you were present for and then one
- 8 your mother had relayed about sort of waking up in the middle of
- 9 the night and he's choking her. Did you ever see directly any
- 10 other sort of acts of aggression or violence that Lionel might
- 11 have had towards Shanna or Aaliyah.
- 12 A. So it wasn't really anything that happened. I know
- 13 like some ... he would raise his voice obviously, he'd go spin
- 14 the tires with the driveway, he would curse and yell excessively
- 15 a lot. And then, you know, I think I went home in 2015, in that
- 16 instance he had slammed his hand on the table but there was
- 17 never anything physical toward Shanna or Aaliyah.
- 18 Q. And was there ever anything sort of objects. So you
- 19 said you saw him slam his fist on the table and he would rev the
- 20 car. Were there ever any sort of he'd get frustrated and take
- 21 it out on objects?
- 22 A. He would bang at the car. But, yeah, he wouldn't like

- 1 throw anything or do anything physically to be able to harm
- 2 them.
- 3 Q. When you say he would bang at the car, which car was
- 4 it?
- 5 A. Either his Jeep or Shanna's car.
- 6 Q. Okay. And what do you mean "bang at the car"?
- 7 A. Like he would pretend that he's fixing something and
- 8 he'd be banging and banging and banging. Like, I don't know,
- 9 like leaving some of his stress on the car I guess.
- 10 Q. This is a bit leading. Did you ever see him throw
- 11 anything?
- 12 A. No, I have never seen him throw anything.
- 13 Q. Did you ever hear of him throwing anything?
- 14 A. No, not that I can recall.
- 15 Q. In terms of sort of specific incidents and sort of his
- 16 emotions, did you notice any sort of fluctuations in his
- 17 emotions? And what I mean by that sort of happy one minute and
- 18 all of a sudden not so happy.
- 19 A. Yeah, that was quite frequent with him. We used to
- 20 call it his switch. You know, one minute he'd be so happy and
- 21 the next minute the switch would turn off and he would lose it,
- 22 so ... It was like walking on eggshells at times.

- 1 Q. How quickly would sort of those moods change with him?
- 2 Say if he's in a happy, pleasant mood and then he wasn't, how
- 3 fast of a fluctuation would that be?
- 4 A. Like a switch, on and off.
- 5 Q. And were they sort of very extreme?
- A. Yeah, I mean, it could be like the littlest thing. He
- 7 would be happy and then something so small like, say, a
- 8 dishwasher not packed properly, switch, all of a sudden he is in
- 9 his rant or his mood so ...
- 10 Q. So I guess in a scenario where he's ... you know,
- 11 there's a dishwasher, he's fine, it's a normal day, and then how
- 12 elevated does he seem over a dishwasher not being packed
- 13 properly?
- 14 (14:20)
- 15 A. Very elevated. Nothing in the normal. Nothing that
- 16 anyone should ever get mad about but he would get extremely mad
- 17 and go on for hours about it.
- 18 Q. Was he ever ... when you said he'd go on for hours
- 19 about it, would be sort of hours about upset about the
- 20 dishwasher?
- 21 A. Yeah, it would be the dishwasher.
- 22 Q. And I guess ... not trying to get any sort of

- 1 professional opinion, but we've all seem people in a general
- 2 day-to-day scenario where something makes them angry and they
- 3 may yell. Was there any sort of, with him, that was sort of
- 4 unusual or different in terms of his level?
- 5 A. I'm sorry, can you repeat that?
- 6 Q. I guess we've all seen someone something makes them
- 7 upset, whether they're called a name and they may react to it.
- 8 And in his case did it seem sort of abnormal to you or unusual
- 9 to you, this all of a sudden ramp up?
- 10 A. Definitely. There was nothing normal about him, you
- 11 know, getting extremely mad about the dishwasher or, you know,
- 12 the things that he got mad over. It was not normal at all.
- 13 Q. And what did you make of the fact that it would sort
- 14 of linger and last for hours as you said?
- 15 A. So ... well, like Shanna would just normally end up,
- 16 you know, blocking him out kind of thing. I guess where she
- 17 would get really annoyed if Aaliyah was home and he was doing it
- 18 and constantly yelling around Aaliyah then, you know, that would
- 19 be really frustrating for her as well. Again, if I was there
- 20 I'd be like blocking him out, but then to an extent where I
- 21 would have to be like okay, like you need to calm down kind of
- 22 thing because this is just craziness. Like the amount of time,

- 1 you know, that he would go on is really excessive.
- 2 Q. And did this sort of, I guess I'll say sudden sort of
- 3 fluctuations or as you described the switch, did this seem more
- 4 frequent in the later years as compared to the earlier years or
- 5 less so?
- 6 A. Oh yeah. No, no, it was definitely the later
- 7 years where it became more excessive.
- 8 Q. Did Shanna ever speak to you about what she was sort
- 9 of making of it, what she was thinking about it?
- 10 A. Well, in the end she just wanted it to be over with,
- 11 you know, which is why he went away to Montreal and he went to
- 12 all these different programs to try to find, you know, different
- 13 resources to help him with his temperament but at the end she
- 14 was just really getting tired of it, as anyone would.
- 15 Q. You've mentioned ... and I don't necessarily need to
- 16 show you the statement unless you're having a difficult time
- 17 recalling it I guess. But you had mentioned in your statement
- 18 that, and I certainly don't want you to repeat the term used,
- 19 but you said ... at one point you said he would get angry and
- 20 then start yelling sort of almost a racial slur. Do you recall
- 21 saying that in your statement? I'm just trying to put that in
- 22 con- ...

- 1 **A.** No.
- Q. Okay, I'm going to ...
- 3 A. Can I see it?
- 4 Q. I'm going to turn to page 8 of your statement. I'm
- 5 just trying to get a sense of if this was out of character for
- 6 him or if it was something new that sort of developed after he's
- 7 left Afghanistan. It's the second ... when it starts you'll see
- 8 an A. there and these are your words:
- 9 He hasn't physically touched her since that
- 10 one night from dreaming but he always, like
- 11 ... if he had like a vision or something or
- an outburst it would always be cursing and
- 13 yelling. You know, Fuck you this, fuck you
- that, or he would repeat things that he
- heard in the military that he used to get
- 16 called like (and I'm not going to repeat
- that word) and every day.
- 18 Was this something kind of new with him?

- 21 A. Yeah, he would ... he wouldn't do that. So that
- 22 wasn't his normal, that was when he was on one of his episodes

- 1 we would call it.
- 2 Q. So this was sort of unusual for him. Like he ...
- 3 would be normally ... I guess pre-Afghanistan is this something
- 4 that he would do?
- 5 A. No. No, never.
- 6 Q. And it wasn't something that he would sort of throw
- 7 around loosely, that term?
- 8 A. No, definitely not.
- 9 Q. And I'm just trying to make as much sense of it as I
- 10 can because I don't know. You talked about he experienced ...
- 11 he would talk about his experiences of racism in the military
- 12 and he would frequently come home and talk about it. And then
- 13 he's upset and he has an outburst and then he's the very term
- 14 which he hadn't used before. Did he ever discuss that with you?
- 15 A. Not necessarily discussing like the words that he
- 16 used. No, he would just talk about the things that he would
- 17 dealt with at work. But as far as the terms that he used to
- 18 call her at times, no, we didn't really go into so much detail
- 19 about it.
- 20 **Q.** And did he ...
- 21 A. I was more focused on his yelling and behaviour, I
- 22 guess.

- 1 Q. Okay. But you said that was sort of ... that was
- 2 something different about it?
- 3 A. Yeah. That was definitely not something that he would
- 4 have done pre-Afghanistan.
- 5 Q. Did he ever use that term in referring to her?
- A. At times he used to.
- 7 Q. And was he saying it in sort of a being upset kind of
- 8 sense?
- 9 A. Yeah, it would ... like when he was in his normal
- 10 state he would never say something like that. But as we called
- 11 when he had his little outbursts or episodes he would ...
- 12 everything would be just off the table for him, anything goes.
- Okay. But in terms of the ... and I know maybe I'm
- 14 asking it too much, but in terms of the Lionel Desmond you knew
- 15 up until pre-Afghanistan, is that something you would see out of
- 16 him?
- 17 **A.** No.
- 18 Q. Did ... I'm trying to get a sense of ... he's had
- 19 these traumatic experiences in the military and serving in
- 20 Afghanistan, did Shanna ever sort of confide in you how it was
- 21 impacting her and Aaliyah, the stress that he was undergoing?
- 22 A. Yeah. Well, it was just ... especially in the end it

- 1 was becoming way too stressful for her. And she was so focused
- 2 on Aaliyah and she didn't want Aaliyah to be around, you know,
- 3 that type of environment. She was very protective of her. And
- 4 then, you know, especially if Aaliyah saw him have outbursts as
- 5 well it was terrifying her; she was scared of her dad when he
- 6 was in those episodes. You know, she used to say, When Daddy's
- 7 good he's really good, but when he, you know, is upset he scares
- 8 me. So she didn't want her own daughter to be scared of her
- 9 father so ...
- 10 Q. And did Aaliyah say that to you or did Shanna relay
- 11 that to you about Aaliyah ...
- 12 A. Aaliyah said that to me.
- 13 Q. So I guess if we can go back to it. Do you recall
- 14 what it was she said to you and in what context?
- 15 A. So this was a time when they were in New Brunswick
- 16 living in our house. Brenda, Lionel's mother, was also there as
- 17 well, we were all sitting down talking. Lionel was angry pretty
- 18 much for the whole day and we were all, you know, in the ... the
- 19 thing was the kitchen and living room were pretty much together.
- 20 So Aaliyah, I said, how do you feel about this, like are you
- 21 okay? Lionel was in the garage working on the car and she's
- 22 like, I love my daddy but when he's good he's really good with

- 1 me, but when he's, you know, mad or upset he scares me because
- 2 he yells too much at Mommy. So especially hearing that from
- 3 Aaliyah it made Shanna's heart melt. You know, she didn't want
- 4 her daughter to have to go through that.
- 5 Q. And did Shanna ever sort of express any views to you
- 6 about whether or not she would leave Aaliyah with him sort of
- 7 alone without either his mother present or someone present?
- 8 A. She used to and then she knew that she just couldn't
- 9 rely on him especially when he had his episodes, so she used to
- 10 get her friends who lived right beside her to watch Aaliyah or
- 11 there was another two friends that used to study the Bible with
- 12 them, to watch Aaliyah and take Aaliyah at times or I used to
- 13 take Aaliyah when I was there.
- 14 (14:30)
- 15 Q. So she sort of developed the concern. Did she express
- 16 it to you that she didn't want to leave Aaliyah alone with him?
- 17 A. Yeah. It wasn't so much as, you know, she was scared
- 18 that he was going to do something to Aaliyah but she just knew
- 19 that like when he was in a state, it was hard for him to focus
- 20 on Aaliyah when he was angry.
- 21 Q. Did Shanna ever discuss with you whether or not she
- 22 wished to sort of maybe speak to someone or reach out to someone

- 1 in terms of any help they might be able to offer her and
- 2 Aaliyah?
- 3 A. She didn't specifically talk to me about it. She
- 4 talked to my mum about it.
- 5 Q. And how did you find out about that, that she spoke to
- 6 your mother about having somebody help her?
- 7 A. It was my mum that told me.
- 8 MR. RUSSELL: Again, Your Honour, this is a very similar
- 9 situation.
- 10 **THE COURT:** Go ahead.
- 11 MR. RUSSELL: So what was this about? What was your
- 12 understanding that she reached out to your mother about?
- 13 A. So this was in the very end, like late in 2016, where
- 14 she was just looking for I think it was the Naomi Society or one
- of those programs to see what her options would be if she was to
- 16 get a divorce and how she would go about dealing with someone
- 17 that has PTSD as excessive as he did.
- 18 Q. And she sort of talked to your mum about looking into
- 19 that sort of thing.
- 20 **A.** Yes.
- 21 Q. Do you know if there was ever sort of a specific time
- 22 where she might have expressed to you that, look, she's going to

- 1 end the relationship and they're going to completely separate?
- 2 Did that ever come up?
- 3 A. Yeah, so that happened a couple of times. You know,
- 4 one time, you know, a couple of times she told me that she was
- 5 done. Well, they both told me that they were done with each
- 6 other. Where I would just say, Okay, well, you have to, you
- 7 know, try to stick it out through sickness and through health,
- 8 deal with it kind of thing. But then at the end, like late in
- 9 2015, early 2016, she was just like, I'm done with this, you
- 10 know. I can't deal with this anymore. It's going on for too
- 11 long. He's not getting the help that he really needs and I
- 12 can't help him, you know. She used to be ... He used to think
- 13 that because she was a nurse that she would be able to help him
- 14 but that's way out of her scope of practice. She just wanted to
- 15 be done in the end.
- 16 Q. Did he ever sort of express to you that he was aware
- 17 that she was ready to be done? Did he ever have that sort of
- 18 share information with you that would suggest that he knew that
- 19 it was over?
- 20 A. Yeah, so a couple of times he would message me and
- 21 then I'd be like, Well, just give her some time, like give her
- 22 some space, you know, you've driving her ... I used to say

- 1 you're driving her crazy, literally. I'm just like, Give her
- 2 space and she'll come around in the end. And then there was
- 3 another time where they were yelling, she contacted me and she's
- 4 like, I'm done, I can't deal with this anymore to where I was
- 5 just like, Okay. I didn't really say anything else about it.
- 6 Just kind of do what's best for you kind of thing. And he used
- 7 to contact me and I'd just be like, Well, she doesn't really
- 8 have anything else that she can do, right. Like you're driving
- 9 this woman crazy so, you know.
- 10 Q. And how did he sort of express his views on the fact
- 11 that she may actually leave him?
- 12 A. He was sad. He didn't really know. I think he was
- 13 more so lost in a sense. He didn't really know what direction
- 14 to take himself. Like it went on for so long and then not to be
- 15 with him and then possibly have to do, you know, custody, who is
- 16 going to get Aaliyah, what time is he going to get Aaliyah. So
- 17 all these things, obviously, were going through his head and
- 18 through his mind.
- 19 Q. Did he ever talk to you about that, sort of what was
- 20 going to happen to Aaliyah and what his plans were if they did
- 21 divorce or separate?
- 22 A. Yeah, so he used to say that, you know, he would find

- 1 his own place and he used to say that he was looking for a place
- 2 in town. So I said, Okay, and that they're going to go to court
- 3 and that, you know, they'll figure out what to do with Aaliyah
- 4 in that sense. But that's all he used to say. He didn't say
- 5 anything more than he was looking for a place kind of thing.
- 6 Q. So I'm just trying to get a sense of when this really
- 7 sort of became a big topic of discussion with you from both of
- 8 them that their separation is going to happen, they're talking
- 9 about Aaliyah, custody, different places. What year is this?
- 10 So if 2016 is sort of the last year. Christmastime is really
- 11 the last ...
- 12 A. I would say about the end of 2015. Either the end of
- 13 2015 or maybe like early on in 2016.
- 14 Q. Did he sort of express to you whether or not he sort
- 15 of came to terms with the fact that it was over or that he
- 16 wanted to continue to work on the relationship? Did you get any
- 17 sense of that from him in your conversations?
- 18 A. Yeah, well, he definitely wanted to work on the
- 19 relationship. He didn't want to give up on Shanna. You know,
- 20 obviously, Aaliyah as well. He did love that family dynamic,
- 21 all of them but ... And, again, like they used to say that
- 22 they're getting a divorce and then, you know, a couple of weeks

- 1 later, they're taking pictures together so ... It was very hard
- 2 to understand but that's just the way it was.
- 3 Q. The concept of jealousy where he would say that he
- 4 thinks she's going with someone else. Did this happen in 2016
- 5 as well?
- 6 **A.** Yes.
- 7 Q. Did it seem any less so or worse or the same in 2016
- 8 compared to when it was before?
- 9 A. I would say it was about the same if not a tad bit
- 10 more. But ... yeah.
- 11 Q. When he would express that he believed that she was
- 12 leaving him, were you ever able to convince him otherwise? In
- 13 terms of leaving him or gone with someone else, did it take a
- 14 lot of convincing to convince him otherwise that, no, she's just
- 15 gone to work or, no, she's just gone to school?
- 16 A. Sometimes. And then, you know, especially if he would
- 17 message Shanna. Say they were arguing or whatnot, he would
- 18 message her and she wouldn't respond back. Then that made his
- 19 mind wander even more to then where the fact where I had to
- 20 message Shanna and be like have a conversation with her,
- 21 screenshot it, and then send it to him to be like, Okay, here's
- 22 your proof, she's at work, or she's here, like just calm down

- 1 kind of thing.
- 2 Q. Would he ever ask for actual proof that you spoke to
- 3 her, she confirmed that she wasn't, then you'd screenshot the
- 4 text and sent it back?
- 5 A. No, he would never ask for proof but I just knew that
- 6 maybe if he saw a conversation from me and Shanna, then he would
- 7 ... It would calm him down more, he would believe me kind of
- 8 thing. So I just automatically just did that and be like, Look,
- 9 this is where she is, like this is the conversation, the time
- 10 and everything is right there, so you're good now. And that
- 11 would calm him down.
- 12 Q. Okay. What information, especially in 2016, what sort
- 13 of information or discussions did you have with Lionel or Shanna
- 14 about him and medication?
- 15 A. I know that he was prescribed marijuana for a
- 16 medication and then he had other medications for bipolar
- 17 disorder or schizophrenia and then, of course, PTSD as well.
- 18 Q. And I know that, and I want to make sure because we
- 19 have his medical records, so we know exactly what he was
- 20 diagnosed with. When you said bipolar and schizophrenia, you
- 21 got this information from who?
- 22 A. Shanna and Lionel.

- Okay, they had relayed that to you. That's how they
- 2 characterized what it was.
- 3 **A.** Yeah.
- 4 Q. And how was he in terms of taking his medications?
- 5 A. He wasn't the best at taking them. Sometimes he would
- 6 take them and he would do really good. Other times, he would
- 7 just stop flat out and be like, Well, no, they're not working
- 8 and then give up on them. So he was off and on with the
- 9 medications.
- 10 (14:40)
- 11 Q. Did he ever express any concern to you about
- 12 medications and taking them?
- 13 A. He just used to say that they're not working.
- 14 Q. Did he say why they weren't working or did he say how
- 15 they made him feel?
- 16 A. He didn't exactly say how they made him feel. He
- 17 used to just say that they weren't working for him, that there
- 18 was no point of him taking them if they're not working kind of
- 19 thing. And he wanted to really just focus on I guess the
- 20 marijuana portion of it. So that's what he did. He said that
- 21 calmed him down a lot more.
- 22 Q. Did you ever talk to him about him on medical

- 1 marijuana?
- 2 A. Like talk to him how?
- 3 Q. Well, I guess did a conversation ever happen between
- 4 you and him about him taking medical marijuana, what he thought
- 5 of it?
- A. Yeah, so when he first got it, he was kind of happy,
- 7 it was like he was back in high school again. So when he first
- 8 started taking it, it was very good. It mellowed him out. He
- 9 was laughing and happy. And then when he came out to Regina, he
- 10 brought it with him as well and I told him, you know, how to get
- 11 onto a plane with it, because I worked at the airport, and the
- 12 requirements he needed. And when he came out here, he used to
- 13 vape it and everything was fine. So, yeah, he enjoyed doing
- 14 that and then I guess later on, he was feeling that it wasn't
- 15 helping as much as it did in the beginning. So he kind of
- 16 slowed down with it.
- 17 Q. Did he ever directly say to you that he felt that the
- 18 effects changed?
- 19 A. Yes, he just said that it's not working as well and he
- 20 also didn't like really smoking either. In the beginning, it
- 21 was something that it was exciting, I guess. It took him back
- 22 to his younger years, but it's not something that he really

- 1 wanted to be doing.
- 2 Q. Did he ever talk to you about how it made him feel?
- 3 A. He said cloud nine, was his words, would be cloud nine
- 4 so ...
- 5 Q. Did he ever talk about any sort of negative effects of
- 6 cannabis or marijuana?
- 7 A. Not like side effects. He just personally just didn't
- 8 want to smoke.
- 9 Q. So I'm going to switch gears a little bit. So we know
- 10 in 2016, so that last year, we know in May to August 15th, he
- 11 went to Ste. Anne's. That's when he went to Quebec and then he
- 12 left middle of August and we're up until Christmas and New Years
- 13 of that year. Did you ever talk to Shanna about how things were
- 14 when he left Ste. Anne's in August. So that last half a year,
- 15 did you ever talk to Shanna about how things were going?
- 16 A. So when he left, we didn't really talk that much.
- 17 Like here and there, we would talk. Because at this point I was
- 18 working two jobs and I was just extremely busy. But he was
- 19 doing well when he first came back and then I guess later on in
- 20 the winter, things started declining again for them.
- 21 Q. And who indicated to you or gave you the idea that
- 22 things were declining again for them towards the winter?

- 1 A. Well, she told me about the incident that she had, I
- 2 think it was around New Years ... or Christmas/New Years where
- 3 it was storming and she ended up ... Well, he ended up putting
- 4 her truck into the ditch, I guess, coming from my aunt's camp.
- 5 And then that's pretty much where the decline kind of went from
- 6 there.
- 7 Q. Okay, I'm going to come back to that. Normally, we
- 8 would discuss it but I want to sort of come back to that towards
- 9 the end because it's sort of is sort of the end of the last
- 10 contact you have with both.
- 11 **A.** Okay.
- 12 Q. So we'll leave that, park it there for a minute. I'm
- 13 just going to look at your statement.
- 14 THE COURT: Mr. Russell, I'm going to stop you for a
- 15 second. Ms. Borden, it's not unusual for us to take short
- 16 breaks in the afternoon. I know we started at 1 o'clock and
- 17 we've gone for about an hour and three-quarters. How do you
- 18 feel about taking maybe a 15-minute break.
- 19 A. That would be great.
- THE COURT: That would be great? All right. So that's
- 21 what we'll do. We'll break and we'll try and make it for about
- 22 15 minutes, okay?

- 1 A. Sounds good.
- 2 THE COURT: All right, then thank you.
- 3 COURT RECESSED (14:46 HRS.)
- 4 COURT RESUMED (15:04 HRS.)
- 5 **THE COURT:** Mr. Russell?
- 6 MR. RUSSELL: Thank you, Your Honour. Hello again.
- 7 **A.** Hi.
- 8 Q. So where we left off, I was trying to find something
- 9 in your statement. I'm going to read a line. It's on page 8,
- 10 line 11. This is you responding to a question: "And he used to
- 11 throw things, but he would never, ever touch any of them like.
- 12 And then after, you know, he used to call me ... always call me,
- 13 and tell me what was going on and I used to say, you know, Calm
- 14 down."
- So in this statement, you did say "and he used to throw
- 16 things". Does that help sort of refresh your memory?
- 17 A. Kind of. To an extent.
- 18 Q. That's fair. I just ... And, certainly, if you don't
- 19 recall particular examples of him throwing things or, in fact,
- 20 you don't recall ever hearing that he threw things, that's quite
- 21 fine as well. I just raise this. You did point out in your
- 22 statement that you said, "and he used to throw things". Do you

- 1 remember that?
- 2 **A.** Yes.
- 3 Q. And when I say, Do you remember that?, do you remember
- 4 saying it in the statement or do you remember actually being
- 5 aware that he used to throw things?
- A. I remember it in the statement but I just can't
- 7 recall, you know, a time that he did do it.
- 8 Q. Okay. Do you recall any sort of discussion with
- 9 Shanna or Lionel about him throwing things?
- 10 **A.** No.
- 11 Q. That's perfectly fine. I just raise it just to be
- 12 thorough and complete. But is it fair to say that chances are
- 13 that when you gave this statement to the RCMP, you wouldn't have
- 14 made something up?
- 15 A. No. Definitely not.
- 16 Q. So it's possible that you would've recalled throwing
- 17 things at the time you gave the statement, but you might not
- 18 recall it now?
- 19 A. No. Not now. My mind is gone now.
- 20 Q. Okay. That's fair.
- 21 I'm going to ask you a little bit about after Ste. Anne's,
- 22 after he leaves Ste. Anne's in August 2015, and any

- 1 conversations you had, I guess, first with Shanna and then
- 2 second with Lionel. But first with Shanna. Did you have any
- 3 conversations with her about Veterans Affairs Canada and
- 4 resources and services after he left Ste. Anne's?
- 5 A. I know that they were ... she was talking about
- 6 getting someone that he could stay connected to. So after he
- 7 left. That was pretty much all I can remember at this point.
- 8 Q. Did she express to you ... You said she talked about
- 9 having someone that he would be connected with. Did she ever
- 10 tell you kind of where along that was in the process or have any
- 11 opinion as to that?
- 12 A. No. We didn't really talk about, you know, how far
- 13 along that they were with it. She just said that she was
- 14 looking for ... Well, they both said that they were looking for
- 15 someone that he could stay connected to once he got out and once
- 16 he was home.
- 17 Q. Did you get a sense of what it was? What was going to
- 18 be the purpose of this person that he would stay connected to?
- 19 Did they ever express to you what they thought this person was
- 20 going to do for him?
- 21 A. So just moreso for like counseling. If he felt, you
- 22 know, like he had a trigger or something, that he has someone

- 1 that he can talk to besides just her.
- 2 Q. In your convers- ... "besides just her" as in Shanna,
- 3 you mean?
- 4 A. Yeah. Shanna.
- 5 Q. In terms of your conversations with Lionel and Shanna
- 6 in August when he leaves Ste. Anne's, did you get a sense of
- 7 whether Lionel was motivated to actually see this person put in
- 8 place for him and then go along with what was being recommended?
- 9 (15:10)
- 10 **A.** I can't recall like him being excited, but I knew that
- 11 he was excited to come home and excited to ... excited that he
- 12 was, you know, able to handle different situations a little bit
- 13 better from what he was taught in Montreal.
- 14 Q. And you said things seemed to get a little bit worse
- 15 as the winter rolled around. What do you mean by that?
- 16 A. Yeah. Well, I wouldn't even say it was just winter.
- 17 I guess when he got back home, there was just one thing after
- 18 the other. It was like he went, and then he was home for like a
- 19 month maybe and everything was good, and then it took a 360
- 20 again where everything was affecting him.
- 21 Q. In your entire sort of time as, I'm going to say, the
- 22 person in the middle, I guess ... You're hearing concerns from

- 1 Shanna. You're hearing the concerns from Lionel. Definitely,
- 2 you've indicated those were very frequent and busy. Was there a
- 3 time period where you thought, things are at an all-time low or
- 4 worse? This is the worst time yet.
- 5 A. Yeah. There was a couple of times where I thought
- 6 that. And Shanna used to get upset at me that I talked to him
- 7 now at this point, you know. She used to say, I don't know how
- 8 you can talk to someone that's degrading your sister, or, you
- 9 know, yelling the way he does. And, at this point, I was just
- 10 like honestly caught in the middle like, you know. He's the
- 11 brother-in-law. She's the sister. He's coming to me with
- 12 problems and she's telling me to kind of back off, kind of
- 13 thing. So I was put in an unusual situation.
- 14 Q. In terms of that period of time after he gets home
- 15 that August from Ste. Anne's up until the tragedy happens in ...
- 16 just past New Years, how would you sort of consider that period
- 17 of time based on ... So based on what you're hearing from
- 18 Shanna and based on what you're hearing from Lionel, how was
- 19 that time period for them?
- 20 A. So it was good like really early and then it, like I
- 21 said, it went downhill pretty quick, to the point where she was
- 22 getting upset at me or he would be saying, you know, something

- 1 that I quite didn't understand, or talking like, I would say,
- 2 gibberish, because one minute he would be saying, you know,
- 3 these random things through text, and I'd be like, Who are you
- 4 talking to? Like what are you talking about? And it was just a
- 5 whole bunch of stuff that really just didn't make any sense. So
- 6 ...
- 7 Q. And we're going to look at some text messages in a
- 8 little bit, but what do you mean, sort of, by "gibberish" that
- 9 he was sending you in text?
- 10 A. Like it honestly made no sense at all, like some of
- 11 the things he used to say. It was like he was talking to
- 12 someone else and I'd be like, Are you talking to me or are you
- 13 having a conversation with someone else? Like I don't know.
- 14 And he'd be like, Oh, I'm talking to my buddy, Dale. So then I
- 15 would respond, Well, you're talking to me, like this is my
- 16 number, kind of thing. But he would still continue on like he
- 17 was having a conversation with someone else through me. So it
- 18 was gibberish on my end.
- 19 Q. So it seemed almost like he would ignore the prompt
- 20 that, Look, you're talking to Shonda, and then he would just
- 21 continue?
- 22 A. Yeah. And then he'd be like, Oh, hi Shonda. Like ...

- 1 like I wasn't just saying, Hey, this is me, kind of thing but,
- 2 yeah.
- 3 Q. That sort of exchange, had you seen that before or was
- 4 that something more recent?
- 5 A. It was more recent. Like from 2016, it ... it ...
- 6 that's when it started happening.
- 7 Q. And when he would say ... then he would acknowledge
- 8 that it was you, would the conversation then continue as though
- 9 he was talking to Dale?
- 10 A. For a minute, yeah, he would continue like he was
- 11 talking to like his friend. And then I'd be like, Lionel, like
- 12 it's me. It's Shonda. And then he would come back and be like,
- 13 Oh, hey Sha-Sha. Like ... yeah, so ...
- 14 **Q.** Did he ever ...
- 15 A. He was all over the place at this point.
- 16 Q. What about actual sort of voice communications you had
- 17 with him. Did you ever experience that sort of confused, all
- 18 over the place, scattered, you said?
- 19 **A.** Like talking on the phone with him?
- 20 **Q.** Yeah.
- 21 A. No. I think when we'd talk on the phone, it was
- 22 towards me. I don't think ... Yeah, I think it was towards me.

- 1 I didn't really notice anything unusual, I guess.
- 2 Q. Okay. Did Shanna ever express to you sort of an
- 3 openness that she either feared for her safety or Aaliyah's
- 4 safety?
- 5 A. Yes, she did.
- 6 Q. Tell me a bit about that.
- 7 A. Well, she was just ... like in the end, she was ...
- 8 in the end, she was quite, I guess, concerned. And so I was
- 9 down home visiting one time and he was having an episode,
- 10 yelling about something. In the beginning, he was fine, and
- 11 then ... You know, because he was happy to see me as well. And
- 12 then a couple ... I'd say about a half hour to an hour later, he
- 13 kind of freaked out, had an episode. And then I was just like,
- 14 Okay. Well, just let him be. Like calm down. Like leave him
- 15 alone, kind of thing. Don't engage it. And she would be like,
- 16 Well, you know ... I'd be like, Shanna, Shanna, like calm down.
- 17 And she'd be like, Well, it's not Shanna, Shanna when you find
- 18 Shanna dead, you know, in the kitchen. He's not playing around.
- 19 I'm just like, Well, you're crazy, kind of thing. But,
- 20 obviously, me just coming home, I'm not knowing the extent of
- 21 how bad it is actually getting with him. So ... yeah.
- 22 Q. So that was sort of ... Do you recall roughly when

- 1 that conversation might've taken place?
- 2 A. Oh. I don't if it was 20- ... I don't know. Maybe
- 3 late 2015, possibly?
- 4 Q. Would it have been before he went off to Ste. Anne's?
- 5 A. Yes. It was before that, I believe.
- 6 **Q.** And ...
- 7 A. Or ... yeah, before.
- 8 Q. So she made this comment. Was it sort of in reaction
- 9 to you trying to get her to work through the difficulties she
- 10 was having in the relationship? Is that how it came out?
- 11 A. Yeah, because when he used to have an episode or
- 12 whatnot, or yelling or curse or whatnot, inside the house, that
- 13 would obviously make her mad. So then they're bickering back
- 14 and forth. So I'm just like, You know, like just leave him.
- 15 Like let him be. Like let him go do his own thing. And so I'm
- 16 like, Shanna, you've got to calm down. Like Shanna, you've got
- 17 to deal with it. You know, it's your husband, kind of thing.
- 18 And then she'll be like, Well, it's not Shanna, Shanna when you
- 19 see me here on the floor so ...
- 20 Q. Did she seem ... That's quite a serious comment. Did
- 21 she seem sincere when she said it? Did she seem actually
- 22 legitimately concerned for her safety?

- 1 A. Now that I think back about it, I would say yes, but
- 2 in that instance, I wasn't really focused on that for some
- 3 reason so ...
- 4 Q. And I got the sense, is it fair to say, that it was
- 5 quite frequent ... Based on what you described, would you say
- 6 it was quite frequent for there to be an incident, perhaps an
- 7 overreaction, then you become pulled into it, and then it
- 8 settles and resolves and it's sort of "rinse, repeat"? Is that
- 9 a fair way to characterize it?
- 10 A. Yeah, I would say so.
- 11 Q. Did Shanna ever make a similar comment about that?
- 12 That "dead on the kitchen floor", did she ever make that similar
- 13 comment any other time?
- 14 A. Not that I recall. The one on the kitchen floor is
- 15 the one that stands out to me the most. That really stuck with
- 16 me, I guess.
- 17 Q. Did she ever talk to you about perhaps whether she
- 18 would go to the police or she was worried over something in
- 19 particular?
- 20 A. Well, I know she did call the police a couple of
- 21 times. She did call the police one time when she was in New
- 22 Brunswick to where they did take his guns away from him then.

- 1 Obviously, he got them back. And then there was an instance
- 2 where it was in 2016 as well where she called the police on
- 3 him again because he was outside in the yard and putting things
- 4 into his Jeep and yelling and cursing. And she called the
- 5 police and he was over at my Aunt Sarah's, which is beside their
- 6 house. So she did call the police on him a couple of times.
- 7 Q. Did you ever discuss with either Shanna or Lionel this
- 8 ... We've learned a little bit about dreams he might've been
- 9 having. Do you recall any conversation with Lionel about
- 10 dreams?
- 11 **(15:20)**
- 12 A. Yeah. He said he had some pretty disturbing dreams.
- 13 Q. If you can tell us a little bit about that
- 14 conversation.
- 15 **A.** It was either dreams that she was cheating on him or
- 16 dreams that he'd killed her pretty much.
- 17 Q. How often did he talk to you about those dreams?
- 18 A. It wasn't often. And it was very subtle too. It's
- 19 not like he went into fuller detail. And then when I go back
- 20 and I look at the text messages, like he would pinpoint
- 21 something out to where ... He would say something and then he
- 22 would say something else to where I didn't really catch on to

- 1 it, kind of thing. So that's the kind of way he would do
- 2 things.
- 3 Q. So what do you mean by that? Do you mean in terms of
- 4 he would say it almost in passing through a conversation?
- 5 A. Yes. So it was like ... It wasn't like, you know, we
- 6 were talking about him having a dream specifically. It was like
- 7 we are having a conversation and he would say something like,
- 8 Oh, I had a dream that I killed your sister or something like
- 9 that. And then he'll change the topic to something else. So
- 10 then I didn't really catch on to what he was saying in that
- 11 exact moment until now when I look back at things.
- 12 Q. Did he ever say what he was ... how he thought or how
- 13 he was reacting to the idea that he was having those dreams?
- 14 A. He said it scared him. He pretty much said it was
- 15 because, you know, of a concussion that he'd had, that he was
- 16 having bad dreams that were leading up to this is why he's
- 17 having, you know, all these things happen to him. He focused it
- 18 on having a concussion so ...
- 19 Q. Did he ever say ... Did he always say that those
- 20 dreams were dreams and not necessarily thoughts or did he ever
- 21 say they were thoughts as well?
- 22 **A.** I would say they were moreso dreams than thoughts.

- 1 Q. Was it the same sort of recurring dream of her with
- 2 someone else and then he reacts to it?
- 3 A. Yeah, I believe so.
- 4 Q. Did he ever describe any other types of dreams or
- 5 other scenarios that were causing him difficulty?
- A. Like when they would argue or something, then he'd be
- 7 like, Oh, tell your sister I have my eyes on a .22 or, you know,
- 8 just things like that. But he would change it so quick that I
- 9 wouldn't even catch on to it.
- 10 Q. And we're going to review a text in a bit about "eyes
- on a .22", but in terms of an actual discussion, a phone
- 12 conversation with him, did he ever make comments about a firearm
- or a suggestion that he might do some harm to Shanna or anyone?
- 14 A. I can't recall him, in a phone conversation, saying
- 15 something like that. Yeah. But I think most of the time when
- 16 he would say something crazy like that, it was in a text
- 17 message.
- 18 Q. And I just ... you know, just so I want to be fair and
- 19 put it in context. You know, normally, we can look back and
- 20 say, If somebody mentions they're going to do something with a
- 21 gun, or implies it, that you would phone the police. But, in
- 22 your shoes, you dealt with Lionel Desmond quite frequently and

- 1 you heard a lot from him frequently and it would be sort of
- 2 repeat. So how did you sort of perceive when he would make the
- 3 reference to that?
- 4 A. Well, sometimes I didn't even catch on. Like now that
- 5 I think back, I'm just like, Well, why didn't you do something
- 6 about it? So, at times, I didn't catch on. And then other
- 7 times, I'd be like, Oh well, he's just having one of his rants,
- 8 kind of thing. But, realistically, obviously, I should've said
- 9 something and done something about it.
- 10 Q. And I definitely don't want to ... That's not the
- 11 purpose of why I'm asking you. Don't sort of ... I know I'm
- 12 ...
- 13 **A.** No, no. Yeah.
- 14 Q. ... giving more of a lecture, Your Honour, than a
- 15 question, but the nature of it is, Shonda, hindsight is a lot
- 16 easier ...
- 17 **A.** I know.
- 18 Q. ... than the reality at the time.
- 19 **A.** Yeah.
- 20 Q. In terms of, I guess, Lionel's perspective of what he
- 21 thought was wrong with him, I'm going to look to a passage in
- 22 your statement. It's page 13. So page 13, line 13. And I'll

- 1 just read it. This is your answer to the officer. You said:
- 2 And I had my own thing going on in Regina,
- 3 so ... but, yeah. Apparently, he said that
- 4 he found out that he does have PTSD and they
- 5 say that ... he's like, Well, they say that
- I'm schizophrenic too, he says, but he's
- 7 like, I also found out that I went to the
- 8 doctor, that I could have a brain tumour, he
- 9 said. So they have to do testing on me.
- 10 And he said, You know what, Shonda, or Sha-
- 11 Sha, he said. He's like, All the times that
- I hit my head. I hit my head on (and then
- it's inaudible) when I fell down some place
- 14 when he was in Afghanistan.
- And then he goes on and says: "Something wrong with my
- 16 head."
- 17 So this is him relaying to you what he thought was wrong
- 18 with him.
- 19 **A.** Yes.
- 20 Q. Realizing, certainly, that he's not a doctor, but did
- 21 he really sort of believe that doctors told him he had
- 22 schizophrenia?

- 1 A. I don't know. He made me believe that he did.
- 2 Q. Okay. And I'm mindful of the fact that he might've
- 3 sort of misinterpreted or misunderstood what was being told to
- 4 him by the doctor but he came ... Do you need a break or ...
- 5 A. No, no. I'm good.
- 6 Q. And, as well, with the brain tumour, did he come right
- 7 out and tell you, They think I have a brain tumour?
- 8 A. Yeah. I have a text message of it.
- 9 Q. And, looking back, was there ever any suggestion that
- 10 he seemed to maybe indicate that he wasn't sure what the doctors
- 11 were telling him, or did he seem confident that, I know what
- 12 they told me?
- 13 A. Well, after he said that the doctors told him that, he
- 14 was very adamant that it was because of the brain tumour or
- 15 concussion that he had that this is why all these things are
- 16 happening to him. That's what he was relaying to me.
- 17 Q. In terms of ... Did he ever discuss generally his
- 18 treatment with you? Who he might've saw? What he might've saw
- 19 people for?
- 20 A. No. He didn't really go into a bunch of details about
- 21 that.
- 22 Q. In all your conversations with him, did it seem to

- 1 you, based on what he told you, that he had a good grasp of the
- 2 structures that were put in place for him to help him? Did he
- 3 really understand what was going on?
- 4 A. I don't necessarily think. I think that he was really
- 5 just taking it as it was coming towards him or as he was dealing
- 6 with it. Yeah.
- 7 Q. In your conversations with Shanna, what did she ...
- 8 did she indicate what she felt that the doctors told him that he
- 9 had wrong with ... I wouldn't say "had wrong with him", but
- 10 what his struggles were caused by?
- 11 A. So when I talked to Shanna and asked her about, you
- 12 know, that he might have the tumour or concussion, she agreed.
- 13 She said that, Yeah, that's what he says, kind of thing. But,
- 14 again, she didn't really know because she wasn't over there with
- 15 him or whatnot, so she was really going by what he was saying as
- 16 well, or maybe ... yeah.
- 17 Q. So in your conversations with her, did Shanna seem
- 18 confident to you that she knew what he was diagnosed with, knew
- 19 what his struggles were, or did it seem as though she was
- 20 unsure? Or neither?
- 21 A. I think she was unsure. I know that she knew that he
- 22 had PTSD and she was very adamant that he had that, but she also

- 1 knew that something else had to be wrong as well, just by his
- 2 actions.
- 3 Q. Did Shanna ever express to you concerns that she
- 4 might've had as it relates to Lionel harming himself?
- 5 **(15:30)**
- A. She was concerned that he was going to kill himself,
- 7 definitely. This was like earlier on. She was moreso concerned
- 8 about his safety in the beginning.
- 9 Q. And what sort of conversation took place ... you said
- 10 she was concerned that he might kill himself. What kind of
- 11 conversations do you recall about that?
- 12 A. Just like when he used to get mad. Like he used to
- 13 talk about, you know, taking himself out or whatnot. He used to
- 14 say, I'm not homicidal, I'm suicidal, kind of thing. And that
- 15 was something that he used to say out of his own mouth plenty of
- 16 times but ... so she never actually thought, well, it would
- 17 switch or occur the way it did. But, yeah, she was concerned
- 18 about him.
- 19 Q. So did Shanna relay that to you? So just so I get
- 20 this right, did Shanna say to you that Lionel Desmond would say,
- 21 I'm not homicidal, I'm suicidal.
- 22 A. No. Lionel used to say that from his own mouth. Like

- 1 I was there when he said that.
- 2 Q. So you heard him say that.
- 3 **A.** Yeah.
- 4 Q. How frequently would he talk that way or say that?
- 5 A. Any time he got mad or any time he talked about, you
- 6 know, someone at work, you know, were the things that, you know,
- 7 he used to deal with at work or whatnot. And he'll be like, you
- 8 know ... like she was concerned maybe he was going to go to work
- 9 and do something against his coworkers. And be like, Well, no,
- 10 I'm not homicidal, I'm suicidal, kind of thing. But it's not
- 11 something that he would say frequently or ... it was just like
- 12 here and there maybe.
- 13 Q. Did you say that she expressed ... were you there when
- 14 she expressed the concern to him that he might go to work and do
- 15 something to someone?
- 16 **A.** Yes.
- 17 Q. And how did that come ...
- 18 A. So like she said that when she was living in New
- 19 Brunswick.
- 20 Q. So how did that come up? Like how did it ... all of a
- 21 sudden, Shanna says, I'm concerned you're going to go to work
- 22 and do something to someone and he counters with, I'm not

- 1 homicidal, I'm suicidal. How did this evolve? How did that
- 2 conversation sort of come into play?
- 3 A. So we were talking about ... this was the time when he
- 4 chased the person that was at work when they were all eating
- 5 when he was drinking the chocolate milk. He actually went after
- 6 this person with a knife. So when he came home, like we were
- 7 all sitting around talking about what happened and then, you
- 8 know, she's like, Well, you just ... you can't go to work or
- 9 whatever, like I'm concerned that you're going to go to work
- 10 maybe and do something. Like you got to calm down, get more
- 11 help. And then he would make the statement and then we'd be
- 12 like, Ohh, kind of thing so ...
- 13 Q. How did he ... you were there for at least ... when he
- 14 said it one time. How did he seem? Did he seem that he's just
- 15 saying it, just throwing it out there, passing it off as sort of
- 16 almost jokingly or in jest, kind of, or was he sort of serious
- 17 about it? How did you ...
- 18 A. No. It was jokingly. Like he was laughing when he
- 19 was saying it. So it was hard to take him serious because ... I
- 20 don't know. He was laughing and smiling at the same time that
- 21 he said it, so I mean it's hard to take someone serious when
- 22 they're laughing about it, too.

- 1 Q. And you said it ... I believe you had said earlier
- 2 it's something that he would say. So he said it, to your
- 3 knowledge, more than once?
- 4 A. Yeah. He said it a couple of times.
- 5 Q. Did you actually hear him say it more than once?
- 6 A. I heard him say it two times. He said it one time at
- 7 my mom's house as well. I can't really remember how it got
- 8 brought up but I do remember him saying it. But, again, he said
- 9 it in a jokingly way, as well. So it's not something that
- 10 really caught my attention.
- 11 Q. And, again, sort of in fairness, is that ... it was
- 12 quite frequent that there would be the argument, perhaps the
- 13 overreaction and then, rinse, repeat, things would calm down, I
- 14 guess. Is that fair?
- 15 A. Yes. That's exactly how it went.
- 16 Q. Okay. I'm going to show you a series of text
- 17 messages. I guess we'll start with Exhibit 175 and 176.

- 20 EXHIBIT P-000176 TEXT BETWEEN LIONEL DESMOND AND SHONDA
- 21 **BOPARAI**
- 22 Q. So these were text messages you had provided Mr.

- 1 Murray and I in preparation after we had met with you preparing
- 2 for today. I'm going to read this into the record and if you
- 3 can ... I'm going to ask then questions about it. Is that fine?
- 4 A. Yeah. Sure.
- 5 Q. So at the very top, I guess first is where did this
- 6 message come from? Where did you take it from?
- 7 A. Facebook Messenger.
- 8 Q. And this would be a message that you understood came
- 9 from whose account?
- 10 A. Lionel.
- 11 Q. And did it go to your account?
- 12 A. Yes, mine.
- 13 Q. So what made you think it came from Lionel, I guess?
- 14 Would you provide some context to that?
- 15 A. Because that's how he always talked to me.
- 16 Q. I guess I ... and I'm mindful of the fact that we're
- 17 not in a traditional, you know, trial but ... so is this an
- 18 account you would frequently have conversations with a person
- 19 that was Lionel Desmond?
- 20 **A.** Yes.
- 21 Q. And you guys would talk about various things that were
- 22 unique to what Lionel knew and what you knew.

- 1 **A.** Yes.
- Q. Okay. So it says up at the top, "April 23rd, 2016,
- 3 6:18 p.m." So this date came off of Messenger?
- 4 **A.** Yes.
- 5 Q. All right. And does it seem consistent with sort of
- 6 your recollection of receiving the message that it was around
- 7 that time?
- 8 A. I quess so.
- 9 Q. Okay. That's fair. So I guess if it's April 23rd,
- 10 that's pre Ste. Anne's.
- 11 **A.** Yes.
- 12 Q. I'm going to read this in. It says, "Hey, Bones ..."
- 13 So is "Bones" ... who is he referring to there?
- 14 A. That's my nickname.
- 15 **Q.** Okay. So:
- 16 Hey, Bones, it's for the best. She and I
- are changing for different reasons. She's
- 18 tired of this, too. She hacked in my
- 19 Facebook. Fine. This is my new one, okay?
- 20 Reason I put everything on Facebook is me
- and her don't communicate well, so I am
- stressed to not eating and I need her to be

- happy with someone else, because I dream
  that is wrong with this relationship between
- 3 us. Yes, she loves her family but I am the
- issue she needs to delete from her mind.
- 5 I'm not cheating. It's just I have no
- 6 control over my dreams, nightmares of her
- 7 with another guy and me hacking them. So I
- 8 need to be alone.
- 9 And then it continues on the next page, so which is Exhibit
- 10 176. For the purpose of this, it cut off. So:
- I'm not abandoned her. Yes, I ceased my
- 12 account. I'm triggering. It's not going to
- stop, so it is best for you and your family
- 14 to know I am going to be divorced and
- homeless. So nice knowing you.
- So I'm going to stop it right there. So is this sort of a
- 17 message that he just suddenly sent off to you? All of a sudden,
- 18 you check your inbox and there's the message?
- 19 A. I believe so. For that day, yes.
- 20 Q. So you talked about him leaving you various messages.
- 21 Were they similar in nature to this? Were there messages
- 22 similar in nature to this?

- 1 **A.** Yes.
- 2 Q. And when he says: "She hacked in my Facebook and I set
- 3 up a new account." Did he have multiple accounts?
- 4 A. So he had an original account and then the original
- 5 account, he made a status pretty much bashing Shanna and the
- 6 family on. So then I responded and like, Take this down, kind
- 7 of thing, like it's nonsense. So I believe that she went in and
- 8 deleted that message or whatnot, or the status that he had. But
- 9 everything was the same. He ended up forgetting the password
- 10 for it and blamed Shanna on it. And then he created a new
- 11 account.
- 12 Q. When you say there was an account and he was bashing
- 13 Shanna and the family, I believe that's what you said, what was
- 14 it ... Do you remember what was said on Facebook, what was put
- 15 on there?
- 16 A. I don't really remember in like full detail, but it
- 17 was, you know, pretty much that they're fighting, they're
- 18 arguing, and that he was pretty much done or something, to when
- 19 a lot of his family is like, Well, leave her and she's no good
- 20 and a lot of the family came into it. His family came into it
- 21 and made it worse and it triggered his high pretty much of
- 22 writing more stuff. So then eventually when he calmed down, he

- 1 deleted it and deleted that Facebook and created a new one.
- 2 (15:40)
- 3 Q. And so when he put this on Facebook, there's a
- 4 reference ... was it sort of on like a public wall where if you
- 5 were friends you could see ... read it? Okay.
- 6 A. Exactly. Yes.
- 7 Q. So it wasn't just a private communication between him
- 8 and Shanna or you and him.
- 9 A. No. It was public.
- 10 Q. Okay. And is that the context where ... in which he
- 11 says: "I put everything on Facebook as me and her don't
- 12 communicate well, so I'm stressed." Is that what he's referring
- 13 to there?
- 14 A. Yes. So Shanna ended up deleting him off her
- 15 Facebook. I guess he didn't know that. So he put it on his
- 16 wall, talking about Shanna. But Shanna couldn't see it, so then
- 17 I was like, Well, look at this, kind of thing. Like why is
- 18 Lionel doing this? And then showed her and then ... yeah.
- 19 Q. And then he goes on further, he says he needs her to
- 20 be happy and he said, "with someone else because I dream that is
- 21 wrong". Do you understand what he's referring to there when he
- 22 says " ... that I dream and it's wrong".

- 1 A. I think it was just ... no, not necessarily.
- Q. Okay. If you're not sure, that's perfectly fine. I'm
- 3 just asking. Did he talk about the dreams of her infidelity and
- 4 the killing and harm ... did he talk about that around the same
- 5 time as this message or were they separate times altogether?
- A. I think it was close in timeframe but it wasn't that
- 7 day.
- 8 Q. He makes a particular reference that says: "I'm not
- 9 cheating. It's just I have no control over my dreams,
- 10 nightmares of her and another guy and me hacking them." So when
- 11 he says, "I'm not cheating" was there ever a discussion with him
- 12 about his infidelities or anything that you had with him?
- 13 A. No. That was random.
- Q. Okay. Did you get a sense of what he's referring to
- 15 here? Is he referring back to the dreams that you had discussed
- 16 with him?
- 17 A. Yeah. So that would be just the dreams. Like he
- 18 would constantly always have dreams of Shanna cheating on him or
- 19 being with somebody else. So that was a recurring thing with
- 20 him.
- 21 Q. And then if we could go to 176, he says: "I'm
- 22 triggering. It's not going to stop, so it is best for you and

- 1 your family to know I am going to be divorced and homeless. So
- 2 nice knowing you." Was it frequent or how often would he talk
- 3 to you in those sort of terms, almost sort of like finality,
- 4 that, Nice knowing you. It's going to be divorce. It's going
- 5 to be over.
- A. He always used to say that. If him and her were
- 7 fighting they would say, well, they're getting a divorce. And
- 8 then, obviously, he stayed at my mom and dad's house. He didn't
- 9 really go up to his family's house very often, so he would
- 10 automatically assume that he would be homeless.
- 11 Q. Did you get any ...
- 12 A. And that no one would talk to him.
- 13 Q. Okay. Did you get any sense of what he was referring
- 14 to when he says: "I'm triggering"? Is that a phrase he used
- 15 before or ...
- 16 A. Yeah. So his triggers were when he would just be in
- 17 like his agitated state, like he would go off on things.
- 18 Q. And when he says: "I'm not abandoning her. I ceased
- 19 my account." What account is he talking about? Do you know?
- 20 A. His bank account.
- 21 Q. And so what's he referring to there about the bank
- 22 account? Do you know?

- 1 A. That he took control over it. So he pretty much made
- 2 it so she wasn't able to access any funds.
- 3 Q. Below that, it picks up ... there's a sort of a thumbs
- 4 down. That's an icon that you posted, like you disagree with
- 5 it?
- 6 A. Yeah.
- 7 Q. And the response back is: "It's uncurable and killing
- 8 me inside, body is high." Do you have any sort of context for
- 9 that, if it's in reference to something?
- 10 A. He just ... he thought that, you know, his sickness
- 11 wasn't going to get any better and he knew that he was getting
- 12 worse, so I just believe that he was, in the end, that he just
- 13 knew that it was a lost hope, I guess.
- 14 Q. Okay. And in terms of your reply, I'll read it. It
- 15 says:
- No, Lionel, it's not for the best. Not
- 17 communicating with Shanna at the moment,
- 18 okay, that's fine. Blasting everything on
- 19 Facebook is not okay, love. I understand
- that you're going through a hard time but by
- 21 wanting to have a divorce because of it and
- 22 your bad dreams is unethical. Shanna loves

- 1 you deeply as does your daughter Aaliyah.
- 2 It says: "I am ... something. This is very hard for her
- 3 ... (I believe it says her) as well." So is this sort of a
- 4 typical way that you would sort of react to him when he would
- 5 make those comments?
- 6 A. Yeah, usually.
- 7 Q. And usually would you have some success with that?
- 8 A. Most of the time, I would.
- 9 Q. And do you know how long sort of the conflict ... if
- 10 this sort of ended it? Or did the conflict continue?
- 11 A. I believe at this particular time it maybe went on for
- 12 like four or five days and then it was back to normal.
- Okay. Did you ever share these messages with Shanna?
- 14 A. Not those ones. Some messages I did.
- 15 Q. So when he was sending sort of messages like this, did
- 16 you advise Shanna that this was sort of, I got this from him and
- 17 he said this.
- 18 A. Yeah. I would talk to her and be like, Lionel
- 19 messaged me, and give her the scoop. But I would never ... like
- 20 sometimes I would send her the message, sometimes I didn't
- 21 because it was just so ... it happened quite a bit.
- 22 Q. So ... and I just want to put that in context. Is

- 1 sort of ... this type of message from him, was it sort of
- 2 something that was rare, common, or ...
- 3 A. It was common.
- 4 Q. Okay. And did you get any sense of did they ever
- 5 increase or decrease with frequency?
- 6 A. I don't know. I think it stayed the same.
- 7 Q. This message, based on the time, if we know that the
- 8 goes to Ste. Anne's about a month later and this is leading up
- 9 to that point, was there any sort of increases in the number of
- 10 messages you were receiving in 2016?
- 11 A. Oh, yeah. 2016, it was constant, constant messages.

- 16 Q. Okay. If we look at Exhibit 181 and 182, there's two
- 17 pages there. So where did this come from, do you know? Where
- 18 was the source of this?
- 19 A. A text message.
- 20 Q. And the text message ...
- 21 A. From his phone.
- 22 Q. From his phone to your phone?

- 1 **A.** Yes.
- 2 Q. And there's a picture there. It's in black and white.
- 3 Who's in the picture?
- 4 A. That's Lionel.
- 5 Q. Okay. This one isn't ... it never had any date on it.
- 6 You're familiar with the contents. Are you able to say roughly
- 7 when it was, what year it might have been?
- 8 A. That was around that same time as well. That was the
- 9 Facebook post that he blasted Shanna on.
- 10 Q. So it was right around the time ... if the other one
- 11 was April 23rd, 2016, this is around the same time?
- 12 **(15:50)**
- 13 **A.** Yeah. Yes.
- 14 Q. So I'm just going to read it. It says ... his message
- 15 to you: "Put it in stone because I have nurse that comes her
- 16 (sic) and she sees the darkness of hell in my house and she
- 17 understands why." Then is this your response below it?
- 18 A. Yes. I'm in the blue.
- 19 Q. And then your response reads: "Then why not talk to
- 20 someone on the phone? Why FB?" "FB", is that Facebook?
- 21 **A.** Yes.
- 22 Q. "Why get others involved?"

- 1 And then it says:
- Deidrea. Did you see her response? Not
- 3 very nice. You can't blame pills for your
- 4 actions. Calm down. Call a nurse or
- 5 doctor, a therapist, or someone.
- 6 So I just want to ... we'll stop there and I just want to
- 7 put some context to this. So is this sort of a ... this
- 8 conversation starts with him sending that first message to you?
- 9 A. I don't know if that was the first message. I'm
- 10 assuming it was since there's nothing above it.
- 11 **Q.** Okay.
- 12 **A.** But, yes.
- 13 Q. Do you know who he's referring to when he says
- 14 "because I have nurse, she sees the darkness of hell in my house
- 15 and she understands why".
- 16 A. Yeah. That was gibberish to me.
- 17 Q. Okay. And, well, you mentioned that before that
- 18 sometimes he would send you sort of gibberish. Is this sort of
- 19 an example of what the gibberish was?
- 20 A. Yeah. That would be one.
- 21 Q. So in this context, you have no idea who the nurse is
- 22 that he's referring to?

- 1 A. None.
- 2 Q. And "darkness of hell in my house", you don't know
- 3 what he's referring to there?
- 4 A. "Darkness of hell", he's referring to himself.
- 5 Q. Okay. And he's referring almost to someone that sees
- 6 the darkness of hell in his house but you don't know who he's
- 7 referring to.
- 8 **A.** No.
- 9 Q. And that obviously prompted you to; one, again talk to
- 10 him about airing stuff on Facebook. And what's this about
- 11 "Deidrea"? Maybe I'm pronouncing the name wrong. Who is that
- 12 person?
- 13 A. That would be his cousin.
- 14 Q. So how did she come into this? What was going on
- 15 there?
- 16 A. So, like I said, he posted some things on Facebook
- 17 blasting Shanna. And then it was his cousins that was online
- 18 saying things that weren't very nice and then I decided to check
- 19 him on it.
- 20 Q. And you referenced, "You can't blame pills for your
- 21 actions." Had there been some conversation between you and him
- 22 and pills being attributed to what he's doing or ...

- 1 A. Yeah. At times, he would just blame medication for
- 2 the way he acted. This was before he started blaming the
- 3 concussion or brain tumour. He would blame medication.
- 4 Q. And you urge him, you say, to calm down, call a nurse,
- 5 a doctor, or therapist. And I'll read his reply. It says: "I
- 6 talked to myself because the devil don't talk. He runs around
- 7 trying to scare people, but I ain't scared of hell." Can you
- 8 put any context to that response at all?
- 9 **A.** Hmm.
- 10 Q. Do you know what he's referring to or anything?
- 11 A. It was just his gibberish that he used to talk all the
- 12 time. He was either ... he referred himself to the devil or
- 13 that he was part of being with the devil or the devil is on his
- 14 right shoulder, you know.
- 15 Q. So was this sort of a theme that he would talk about,
- 16 that either he was the devil, he was with the devil, or the
- 17 devil was on his shoulder?
- 18 A. Yeah. That's how he was. He even changed his
- 19 Facebook name to Lionel Demon so ...
- 20 Q. I'm just trying to put it in context. If this is
- 21 April of 2016 and he's making the comment about, "I talked to
- 22 myself because the devil don't talk", to your knowledge, when

- 1 did he start talking about he's with the devil, the devil is on
- 2 his shoulder, or he is the devil? When did all of that start?
- 3 **A.** Say 2015, 2016.
- 4 Q. And did you ever have any conversation with him about
- 5 the Facebook account that said "Lionel Demon"?
- 6 A. Yeah. I asked him why he changed his name to it and
- 7 he's like ... he said he made a mistake at first. So then I'm
- 8 like, Okay, well change it, like fix it. And he was like, No,
- 9 that's good. The devil is with me. So that's what he kept it
- 10 as.
- 11 Q. Do you know when he changed that Facebook profile to
- 12 Lionel Demon?
- 13 A. Yeah, when he created the new account.
- 14 Q. And would that have been around the same time, like
- 15 April of 2016?
- 16 **A.** Yes.
- 17 Q. So did you ever have ... did you ever share these
- 18 messages with Shanna or have a conversation with her about them?
- 19 A. No. We talked about the status that he had on
- 20 Facebook and what was happening, but not into detail.
- 21 Q. And what do you mean about the "status"? What was
- 22 that?

- 1 A. Like I just talked about like what he had posted on
- 2 Facebook and I showed her the screenshot.
- 3 Q. Okay. Did Shanna ever talk to you about her hearing
- 4 him referring to the whole devil and association and whether he
- 5 was or he was with or was on his shoulder? Did you ever have
- 6 any conversation with Shanna about that?
- 7 A. Not really. No, not really.
- 8 Q. Do you remember ...
- 9 A. But I know that she was concerned about him changing
- 10 his name to Lionel Demon, kind of thing. But, at this point,
- 11 she didn't even have him on Facebook anymore so it was just kind
- 12 of like a whatever thing.
- 13 Q. Okay. Can you think of any other context where he
- 14 would bring up this idea of the devil? You said it started
- 15 around 2015 and '16.
- 16 A. Yeah. Just really any time that he got mad, he used
- 17 to talk about the devil or demons or something foolish like
- 18 that.
- 19 Q. Did he ever talk that way earlier than 2015 that
- 20 you're aware of?
- 21 A. Not that I can recall.
- 22 Q. Your response, you say: "Oh, my goodness, Lionel, no

- 1 one can help you if you keep repeating it over and over again.
- 2 Take your nonsense down. I love you very much but you got to
- 3 stop. This is ..." And then it's C-R-A ... Do you remember
- 4 what that was? This is ...
- 5 A. I think it is ...
- 6 Q. If you don't, that's fine.
- 7 A. I don't know. I can't see it.
- 8 Q. It seems to be cut off. Right at the bottom of the
- 9 page? It says: "Take your nonsense down. I love you very much
- 10 but you got to stop. This is ..."
- 11 A. "This is crazy." That's it.
- 12 **Q.** Okay.
- 13 A. Hold on. I can find it on my phone.
- 14 Q. So you still have that on your phone, do you?
- 15 A. Yeah, somewhere. I'm just trying to find it.
- 16 Q. That's all right. We can ... if it's okay with the
- 17 judge, I can get that information after or if the Court ... yes?
- 18 **THE COURT:** Yes, that's fine.
- 19 Q. We'll get it later, Shonda.
- 20 A. Okay. Sure.
- 21 Q. So when you say ... you make reference that "you keep
- 22 repeating it over and over again", what are you referring to?

- 1 A. I think I was just talking about moreso like that he's
- 2 talking to himself kind of thing.
- 3 Q. Okay. And then if we turn to Exhibit 182, his reply
- 4 reads: "Talking to my realtor and more stories. Wow. She has
- 5 a sour tongue. Want me to lie to them. This is going to be in
- 6 the paper." What's he referring to there? Do you know what the
- 7 context is, that she has "a sour tongue"?
- 8 A. No. He was just making up stuff at that point.
- 9 (16:00)
- 10 Q. And then below it: "Let her know I've got eyes on a
- 11 .22 Magnum. Also, the car is going. I'm declaring bankruptcy
- 12 and they're going after her." Did Lionel Desmond ever refer to
- 13 a firearm or that he's got "eyes on a .22 Magnum" or any firearm
- 14 before this text?
- 15 A. No. Not that I can recall.
- 16 Q. And, at the time, how did you sort of react or
- 17 interpret this comment that he made?
- 18 A. I think I was just really confused.
- 19 Q. And what was it about it that sort of you felt
- 20 confused?
- 21 A. Because I guess we were just really deep into like
- 22 talking about something and then he brings up that he has eyes

- 1 on a .22. So then I was kind of like, Well, why are you talking
- 2 about guns all of a sudden, kind of thing? So it was just
- 3 confusing.
- 4 Q. And just below that, you indicate exactly that. You
- 5 say: "Why are you talking about guns?" His response: "That
- 6 calms me down. Bring back memories. So you let her know I'm
- 7 not paying no bills after bankruptcy. She will see."
- 8 Did you ever have a conversation with him before about how
- 9 talking about guns calmed him down?
- 10 A. No. That was the first.
- 11 Q. And do you know what he's referring to when he says
- 12 "bring back memories"?
- 13 A. Memories of a gun, Afghanistan, I'm assuming.
- Q. Okay. And, again, he's talking about bills and
- 15 bankruptcy.
- 16 **A.** Mm-hmm.
- 17 Q. Did you ever have a conversation with Shanna about
- 18 this series of messages?
- 19 **A.** No.
- 20 Q. And was there a particular reason why you didn't?
- 21 A. I have no idea.
- 22 Q. Okay. And did Shanna ever talk to you about whether

- 1 or not she feared that ... or did Shanna ever talk to you about
- 2 him talking about guns or threats of guns before?
- 3 A. No. Like I know that she was concerned about his guns
- 4 that he had in New Brunswick. Moreso concerned about what he
- 5 was going to do to himself, but, at that point, she wasn't
- 6 concerned about herself.
- 7 EXHIBITS P-000177 TO P-000180 TEXT MESSAGES BETWEEN LIONEL

#### 8 DESMOND AND SHONDA BOPARAI

- 9 Q. Okay. And the last series of text messages, Exhibits
- 10 177 to 180. I call them text messages, I guess. So where do
- 11 these messages come from?
- 12 A. They're from Lionel's phone.
- 13 Q. And it has, up at the top left: "Lionel" and there's
- 14 a number there. Whose phone number is that? Do you know?
- 15 A. That's Lionel's number.
- 16 **Q.** Okay.
- 17 A. It was his number.
- 18 Q. And there's an "L" with a circle down at the bottom
- 19 corner of the page. It says: "Sorry. Can't talk right now.
- 20 Call back later." Whose message is that?
- 21 A. That's Lionel's.
- 22 Q. And then if we turn the page ... So that message:

- 1 "Sorry. Can't talk right now. Call back later" seems to say
- 2 17:30 is the time. And then a period of time passes. At 20:36,
- 3 there's a photo. Who's in the photo?
- 4 A. Lionel, Shanna, and Aaliyah.
- 5 Q. And just so I back-pedal, I guess. Sorry. On Exhibit
- 6 177, there's a date and time. It says, "Tuesday, November 8th,
- 7 2016". So we're post-Ste. Anne's. Now, I know you weren't
- 8 necessarily logging and marking everything down, but does it
- 9 seem consistent that we're into the winter that you recall this
- 10 is a later message?
- 11 **A.** Yeah.
- 12 **Q.** Sorry?
- 13 **A.** Yes. Yes.
- 14 Q. So we go to 178. There's a message from him with the
- 15 family photo and the same sweaters, and it reads: "Matching
- 16 sweaters!" at 20:36. And then your reply: "Haha. I love it.
- 17 Aaliyah is growing. Holy smokes. Thought she was me for a
- 18 second." And then there's a reply back, what appears to be from
- 19 him, that says: "Show mom. Going to get family pictures taken
- 20 with them" at 20:49.
- 21 So you get these messages. Is this, as well, consistent
- 22 with some of the messages you would get from him?

- 1 A. No. This was exact- ... actually from Shanna. Her
- 2 phone was dead at the time, so she messaged me from his phone.
- 3 Q. So was it Shanna that sent you this photo?
- 4 **A.** Yes.
- 5 Q. Okay. And the comments about: "Show mom. Going to
- 6 get family pictures", you believe that that was Shanna using his
- 7 phone?
- 8 **A.** Yes.
- 9 Q. And then at ... So that is Tuesday, November 8, 2016.
- 10 If we turn to Exhibit 180, and it shows Friday, November 25th,
- 11 2016, the next message is: "Let Shanna. I'm phoning the
- 12 police." And then your reply appears to be, "What's going on,
- 13 Lionel?" And then you say, "Hello?"
- So is this sort of a conversation that's initiated by him?
- 15 A. Yes. He's done that.
- 16 Q. And did you know why he was phoning the police? He
- 17 just sent you a message and said, on November 25th, "I'm phoning
- 18 the police." Did he provide any context for that right away?
- 19 A. Yeah. After I said, "Hello", he stated why.
- 20 Q. And then we see a reply.
- 21 A. What was going on.
- 22 Q. It says: "Just blue mad. Shanna went somewheres.

- 1 Didn't tell me, so I called the police because I will snap, and
- 2 I'm trying to focus, but she left. We had an argument and she
- 3 took Aaliyah. I called Visa just to see where she was last.
- 4 Your dad said she went to Halifax. Well, I would have liked if
- 5 she had told me." If we turn the page, this is sort of where
- 6 the message cut off. And then it says ... where it said: "I
- 7 called Visa just to see where she was last. Your dad said she
- 8 went to Halifax. Well, I would've liked if she told me. So
- 9 they will be checking things out."
- 10 Is this the Halifax date that you were referring to earlier
- 11 about the game?
- 12 **A.** Yes.
- 13 Q. And when he says he called Visa, what did you
- 14 understand that to be?
- 15 **A.** He was just trying to find out her location if she
- 16 used the credit card to see where she was.
- 17 Q. And then he says: "Because I will snap, and I'm
- 18 trying to focus." Would this be sort of a typical reaction for
- 19 him? She's gone. He says he's going to snap?
- 20 **A.** Yeah.
- 21 Q. This type of message, how frequently did you get a
- 22 sense of him getting upset when she left?

- 1 A. Usually, he would if he just didn't know or he just
- 2 forgot that she was going somewhere, then he would normally get
- 3 upset. And, as you can see, it's like 8:00 my time, so it was
- 4 past my bedtime because I worked 2:00 in the morning. But,
- 5 yeah.
- 6 Q. Was it typical for him to just sort of reach out to
- 7 you with something as drastic as, I'm phoning the police. She's
- 8 gone. I'm calling you to find out where she's at?
- 9 A. Yeah. He would message me any time of the day.
- 10 Q. And did you ever talk to Shanna about what she thought
- 11 or how she felt about him doing this sort of thing?
- 12 A. Well, she's the one that started it. Every time that
- 13 he got mad, she would just say to contact me. So that's pretty
- 14 much how it started.
- 15 Q. Okay. And this was in November of 2016. Do you
- 16 remember getting any similar messages to this in 2016?
- 17 A. There's a whole bunch of messages.
- 18 Q. Okay. And the last one, Shonda, I just want to look
- 19 at is Exhibit 285. This seems to be dated December 2nd, 2016.
- 20 Do you know where this was taken from?
- 21 EXHIBIT P-000285 DECEMBER 2, 2016 TEXT MESSAGE FROM LIONEL
- 22 **DESMOND TO SHONDA BORDEN**

- 1 A. My cell phone.
- 2 Q. Cell phone? And is this a message that Lionel had
- 3 sent to you?
- 4 **A.** Yes.
- 5 **(16:10)**
- 6 Q. And I'll just read it. It says:
- 7 I hit my skull off the LAV back in 2005. I was a
- 8 driver in the training area. I put down the hatch,
- 9 rolled over. 32-ton vehicle whacked me. Head.
- 10 Passed out 15 minutes. Came to. I was shaken by it.
- I never let it heal. Went tour. Fell off a wall
- 12 2007. 2008, jump course, hit my head off the plane
- and thundered into the ground. That's all not related
- 14 to PTSD. Some is by concussions. Is making mind and
- dreams feel real bad, but they are not. I need to
- 16 retain my brain. It's terrible. I need to manage it.
- 17 Hope for the best. Night, Sasha.
- 18 Who's Sasha?
- 19 A. Sha Sha. One of my other nicknames.
- 20 Q. Sha Sha. Sorry. So it's a nickname he had for you.
- 21 **A.** Yeah.
- 22 Q. So would it be typical that he would just send

- 1 messages about what he thought was wrong with him in terms of
- 2 that he had a concussion?
- 3 A. Yeah. Normally, he would.
- 4 Q. Was there any sort of context for this? Why, all of a
- 5 sudden, he's sending you a message and saying, There's something
- 6 wrong with me. I had these accidents and ...
- 7 A. I don't really remember. I think that's one of those
- 8 ... part of our conversation that we had, but I think this one
- 9 was pretty random because it was late in the night that I got
- 10 it.
- 11 Q. Would you ever get other similar sort of random
- 12 messages from him that would just sort of unload what he thought
- 13 was wrong with him?
- 14 A. Yeah. He would either say it was this, concussions,
- 15 or, you know, his mind is messed up. His brain.
- 16 Q. Would you say that it was a recurring theme with him
- in 2016, when he's speaking with you or sending messages to you,
- 18 that he's trying to figure out what is wrong with him?
- 19 A. Yes, I would think so.
- 20 Q. So I'm going to go right to at the end here. 2016.
- 21 Sort of what do you know about sort of that Christmas break
- 22 between Christmas and New Years? Were you in Nova Scotia at the

- 1 time?
- 2 A. No. So ... No, I was home.
- 3 Q. In Saskatchewan.
- 4 A. In Saskatchewan. Yeah.
- 5 Q. So do you have any conversations with Shanna between
- 6 Christmas and, say, January 1st? Christmas and New Years?
- 7 A. On the phone, we had a con- ... like just talked, but
- 8 it wasn't anything about him. It was just, you know, just
- 9 catching up. Hi, bye, kind of thing.
- 10 Q. Did you get any sort of sense that over between
- 11 Christmas and New Years, that there was any sort of conflict,
- 12 tension, or problems between Lionel and Shanna?
- 13 A. So again like the incident that happened with her
- 14 truck around New Years, but then that was pretty much the only
- 15 thing I can remember of her complaining about something.
- 16 Q. What do you remember about the conversation about the
- 17 truck and New Years? So you're speaking to Shanna. What's the
- 18 conversation about?
- 19 **A.** It was just that they all went up there. Well, they
- 20 all went up to my aunt and uncle's. What's it called? Camp.
- 21 Sorry. They all went up to the camp and had a good time. They
- 22 were going home. I guess it was snowing and he was driving the

- 1 truck. Apparently, he ended up putting the truck ... he started
- 2 to go in the ditch then where my sister was like trying to pull
- 3 it back over to the road. And I guess he was very upset about
- 4 it going into the ditch, or almost going into it. She didn't
- 5 think anything of it. Like it wasn't a big deal to her, you
- 6 know. It's not like it was a big ditch or anything. The truck
- 7 wasn't ruined. But I guess he was embarrassed by it to then
- 8 where he just went on and on about it and, yeah, to where he
- 9 couldn't calm down from that ... from that time.
- 10 Q. What did she say about ... So your understanding that
- 11 he couldn't calm down, that came from her?
- 12 A. Yeah. She just said that he made a big deal out of
- 13 nothing. Like she said, It's not a big deal, but he made a big
- 14 deal out of nothing and now he's on one of his rants again so
- 15 ...
- 16 Q. Did she say how he was ranting or how he was acting as
- 17 a result?
- 18 A. Well, she didn't exactly say, but we all know how he
- 19 rants and he goes on. Like he'll yell and curse and ... So
- 20 that's pretty much what I figured that he was doing since she
- 21 said he was ranting.
- 22 Q. Did she ... During this time, so after New Years, do

- 1 you have the conversation on January 1st or 2nd? When do you
- 2 have this conversation? Do you remember?
- 3 A. I think it was January 2nd.
- 4 Q. Okay. Does she indicate to you whether or not like
- 5 this time was any sort of different than other times in terms of
- 6 his reaction or overreaction?
- 7 A. No. She just said, He's on one of his rants again.
- 8 So when she said "again", I just took it as it's one of the
- 9 things that he normally did kind of thing.
- 10 Q. Was there anything in the conversation that made it
- 11 seem like this particular incident and his reaction to it,
- 12 getting on a rant, wouldn't let it go, was there any indication
- 13 from her that this somehow ... this event and his reaction was a
- 14 little different in any way from other times before?
- 15 A. Well, she mentioned, when he was at my aunt's house
- 16 packing up some of his things, that he did threaten to kill all
- 17 of them again. So when she mentioned that, I was just like, Oh
- 18 wow, kind of a thing. But she did contact the police that day
- 19 so ...
- 20 Q. So I'm going to ask you about that. This is the first
- 21 time that I've heard it. So she talks to you in that phone call
- 22 and she says what about being up at the aunt's and the threat?

- 1 What was it again?
- 2 A. So he was over at my Aunt Sarah's house with his Jeep.
- 3 **Q.** Yes.
- 4 A. I guess he came to collect some things or whatnot.
- 5 And she just mentioned that he was going off and that he was
- 6 going to shoot them all. That's what she said, He said he's
- 7 going to shoot all of us this time. So she did contact the
- 8 police, but I think by the time that the police came over to my
- 9 aunt's house, they just pretty much told him that he has to
- 10 leave. So ... I'm going to try to find that text message for
- 11 you.
- 12 Q. Yeah. Just ... and we would have any sort of
- 13 interactions she might've had with the police. So is it your
- 14 recollection that she told you she phoned the police? Are you
- 15 sure of that?
- 16 **A.** Yes. Yes. 100 percent.
- 17 Q. So she told you, as a result of that, that she'd
- 18 phoned the police.
- 19 **A.** Yes.
- 20 **THE COURT:** I'm going to stop you. You said that you
- 21 have a text message? Who is the text me- ...
- 22 **A.** I do.

- 1 **THE COURT:** Who is the text message from?
- 2 A. Shanna.
- 3 **THE COURT:** It's from Shanna? And ...
- 4 **A.** Yes.
- 5 THE COURT: And in the text message, what is it that
- 6 she's describing in the text message?
- 7 A. That he was outside yelling and cursing. And so he
- 8 was over at my aunt's house yelling and cursing. And then she
- 9 said that he was ... said that he was going to shoot them all in
- 10 the house.
- 11 **THE COURT:** Oh. In your aunt's house?
- 12 A. No. My sister. So my mom's house.
- 13 **THE COURT:** In your mom's house. Okay.
- 14 **A.** Yes.
- 15 **THE COURT:** So you think you have that text on ... you
- 16 have that on your phone right in front of you?
- 17 A. Yeah. I'm just looking for it right now.
- 18 **THE COURT:** Okay. Well, you just take a minute and look
- 19 for it then.
- 20 (16:20)
- 21 A. (looking for text message) Oh man. Sorry, guys.
- 22 **THE COURT:** Pardon me?

- 1 A. Okay. So she messages me and she's like: "Oh, the
- 2 war is on now." And then she states: "Yeah. The threats are
- 3 rolling in. He wants to kill all of us. Yelling and cursing in
- 4 Aunt Sarah's yard." And I said: "For what?" And she says:
- 5 "Because he was making threats and the RCMP took his guns in New
- 6 Brunswick and told me to take the ones here and to keep them
- 7 from him until they tell me." And then I said: "Oh, that's
- 8 crazy." And then she said: "Then he went up the road yelling at
- 9 Brenda saying she's talking about him. He needs help but won't
- 10 tell them the whole story." And I said: "My, my, my." And then
- 11 she states: "Back and forth in the yard. Hysterical."
- 12 **THE COURT:** And the date of that is? Can you give us
- 13 the date, please?
- 14 A. The date is November 30th, 2015.
- 15 **THE COURT:** Thank you. I take it that was the event
- 16 that he came to Nova Scotia looking for his rifle that the RCMP
- 17 ...
- 18 MR. RUSSELL: It is, Your Honour.
- 19 **THE COURT:** ... from Fredericton advised her that his
- 20 ... Shanna to turn over to the RCMP for safekeeping.
- MR. RUSSELL: Yes.
- 22 **THE COURT:** That was the ... Okay, thank you. Thank

- 1 you, Ms. Borden. Go ahead, Mr. Russell.
- 2 MR. RUSSELL: So Shonda, just so we sort of clarified
- 3 there the comments about "the war is on". Earlier, when you
- 4 referenced about the incident where he said he was going to
- 5 shoot everyone in the house, is it possible that you were
- 6 mistaken on the date? That it was actually November that you
- 7 were referring to?
- 8 A. Yeah. So that was November 2015, not '16.
- 9 Q. Okay. So in terms of your memory, from your
- 10 conversation with Shanna on January 2nd, is it fair to say that
- 11 there was no discussion about him going to shoot the family?
- 12 **A.** No. No. No.
- 13 **Q.** Okay.
- 14 A. No. I don't think so.
- 15 Q. I just want to make sure.
- 16 **A.** No. No.
- Q. Okay. So that conversation that you have on the 2nd,
- 18 did anything seem any different, I guess is my question, than
- 19 other times before in terms of elevated concern?
- 20 A. No. Everything was in the norm. Like he would go
- 21 off, but there wasn't anything that was making her say a lot of
- 22 things to me.

- Okay. And when did you last speak to Lionel Desmond,
- 2 either by text message or by phone? This is January 2nd, you're
- 3 talking to your sister. Did you hear from Lionel over
- 4 Christmas? After New Years?
- 5 A. I talked to Lionel ... The last time I talked to him
- 6 was, I'd say, three days before the incident happened, he
- 7 contacted me.
- 8 Q. And so three days before it happened would've been
- 9 January 1st? New Years?
- 10 A. Yeah. But it was just a regular conversation, like it
- 11 wasn't anything. And then he contacted me on the 2nd but I
- 12 didn't answer. And he contacted me on the 3rd but I didn't
- 13 answer that time either.
- 14 Q. So your last actual conversation with him was it by
- 15 phone, voice, or by text?
- 16 A. It was by phone.
- 17 Q. And what was the conversation about?
- 18 A. They were making plans to come out for March break.
- 19 So they were just talking about March break and ticket prices.
- 20 Q. And so when you say "three days before", that would be
- 21 January 1st. This is after, I guess, the drive home when the
- 22 truck goes in the ditch? Am I interpreting that right?

- 1 **A.** Yes.
- 2 Q. And did anything seem out of the ordinary, from his
- 3 perspective, that things weren't going well or he was upset?
- 4 A. No. He didn't talk to me about anything that time.
- 5 It was just basically what they were going to do for March.
- 6 Q. So during that conversation, did you get any sense
- 7 that anything was off or not good with the relationship?
- 8 **A.** No.
- 9 Q. Did you speak to Shanna after the 2nd where she talks
- 10 to you about him going on a rant, I believe it was you
- 11 described, about putting the truck in the ditch? Did you speak
- 12 to her on another day after that?
- 13 **A.** I spoke to her on the 3rd.
- 14 Q. And the conversation on the 3rd, do you remember when,
- 15 roughly, that was? Was it ... I know there's a time
- 16 difference, so there's three hours we're ahead.
- 17 A. It was early morning for me.
- 18 **Q.** Okay. So ...
- 19 A. I was just sitting down.
- 20 Q. So around what time in the morning? Do you remember?
- 21 **A.** I'd say around 8, 9?
- 22 Q. And that's your time in Saskatchewan.

- 1 **A.** Yeah.
- 2 Q. So who calls who? Do you call her or does she call
- 3 you?
- 4 A. She called me.
- 5 Q. And what was that conversation about?
- 6 A. It was a very quick conversation. She just was asking
- 7 me who somebody was trying to add her on Facebook. One of my
- 8 friends was trying to add her and she was just like, That's
- 9 weird, kind of thing. And then she was like, Okay, I'll talk to
- 10 you later. And then that was pretty much the extent of the
- 11 conversation.
- 12 Q. And it's later that day you learn about what took
- 13 place?
- 14 **A.** Yes.
- 15 Q. When you spoke to her 8 or 9 your time, how long was
- 16 that conversation?
- 17 A. Like maybe five, ten minutes.
- 18 O. Did she mention Lionel Desmond at all in that five to
- 19 ten-minute conversation?
- 20 **A.** No.
- 21 Q. Did anything seem off to you or different about how
- 22 the relationship was or any concerns?

- 1 A. No. She was her happy self. Everything seemed fine.
- 2 Q. And did you get ... You said Lionel Desmond tried ...
- 3 Lionel tried to contact you. Did he try to contact you on the
- 4 3rd as well?
- 5 A. Yes, he did.
- Q. Was that before or after you spoke to your sister?
- 7 A. It was before. He contacted me early in the morning
- 8 and I was still sleeping.
- 9 Q. Okay. And you didn't answer the phone.
- 10 **A.** No.
- 11 Q. Do you know if there was a message left from him?
- 12 A. No message.
- 13 Q. Did you receive any text message from him on the 3rd?
- 14 **A.** No.
- 15 Q. No further questions, Your Honour.
- 16 **THE COURT:** Thank you.
- 17 MR. RUSSELL: Thank you, Shonda. The other lawyers most
- 18 likely will have a few questions.
- 19 **THE COURT:** So I understand that Mr. Anderson and Ms.
- 20 Lunn are not here today and that we knew they wouldn't be here
- 21 today. Ms. Ward? Ms. Grant?
- 22 MS. WARD: We have no questions, Your Honour.

#### SHONDA BORDEN, Cross-Examination by Mr. Macdonald

- 1 **THE COURT:** All right. Thank you. Mr. Macdonald?
- 2 MR. MACDONALD: I do. Thank you, Your Honour.
- 3 **THE COURT:** Thank you.

# 5 CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. MACDONALD

- 6 (16:30)
- 7 MR. MACDONALD: Hi Shonda. It's Tom Macdonald. I'm the
- 8 lawyer for your mother and father and Sheldon. We've spoken on
- 9 the phone before. I have my mask on.
- 10 **A.** Hi, Tom.
- 11 Q. Shonda, I wanted to ask one question. And earlier in
- 12 this session, before we paused because of the lockdown, some
- 13 evidence was given that suggested that Lionel contributed to
- 14 your parents' businesses; specifically, your mother's
- 15 businesses, and also gave money to your family. Do you have any
- 16 light you can shine on that particular evidence for us? Did it
- 17 happen?
- 18 A. No. Lionel has never, ever paid for any of the
- 19 businesses. If you want to say helping to put up shelving is
- 20 paying, then I guess we all did that, but as financially, no.
- 21 Q. Those are my questions. Thank you very much.
- 22 **THE COURT:** All right.

- 1 MR. MACDONALD: Thank you, Your Honour.
- THE COURT: Thank you, Mr. Macdonald. Ms. Miller? I
- 3 think the deputy is just going to clean the podium first here.

# 5 CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MS. MILLER

- 6 (16:32)
- 7 MS. MILLER: Thank you. Shonda, my name is Tara Miller
- 8 and I am counsel representing Brenda Desmond and Aaliyah
- 9 Desmond, sharing that with Mr. Macdonald as well. Just a couple
- 10 of quick questions for you.
- 11 You've been in Saskatchewan for nine years, did you say?
- 12 A. Yeah. I would say nine years.
- 13 Q. So did you move there in 2012?
- 14 A. Yeah, the end of 2012, I would say.
- 15 Q. Okay. You shared with us earlier on this afternoon
- 16 that when you were living with Lionel and Shanna in New
- 17 Brunswick, there was an episode where Lionel had grabbed Shanna
- 18 by the throat while she was sleeping, and she told you about
- 19 that the next day?
- 20 **A.** Mm-hmm.
- 21 Q. Do you remember if Sheldon was living with you at that
- 22 same time?

- 1 A. I believe Sheldon was up there. I don't know if he
- 2 was in school at that time or if he was just visiting but I
- 3 believe that he was around.
- 4 Q. Okay. Thank you.
- 5 You also had said earlier that there were a couple of times
- 6 that you heard Shanna on the phone trying to figure out
- 7 something about military records? I don't know if that helps
- 8 refresh your memory from what your evidence was. I just want to
- 9 drill down on that. When you heard Shanna on the phone, you
- 10 said, Multiple times, trying to figure out how to get military
- 11 records? Is that what you had said?
- 12 **A.** Yes.
- 13 **Q.** Okay.
- 14 A. I think I was referring to medical records.
- 15 **Q.** Medical records. Thank you. And do you recall when
- 16 that period of time would've been when she would've been on the
- 17 phone trying to get medical records?
- 18 A. No, I don't. Sorry.
- 19 Q. Okay. Would it have been before you moved to
- 20 Saskatchewan?
- 21 **A.** Yes.
- 22 Q. And so it would be during the period of time when

- 1 Lionel was still in the military?
- 2 **A.** Yes.
- 3 Q. Okay. And do you have any other specifics, Shonda,
- 4 about the nature of the medical records that Shanna was trying
- 5 to secure at that time?
- 6 A. I believe that they were just wanting to look at
- 7 different doctors. So if they wanted to get a new doctor that
- 8 was possibly outside of the military, they would need those
- 9 records.
- 10 Q. Okay. Do you know when, or do you recall when, Lionel
- 11 purchased the car for your sister? Do you know what year that
- 12 would've been?
- 13 A. I would say ... I have no idea.
- 14 Q. Okay. Would it have been when she was in school? Or
- 15 was it before she was in school? I'm just trying to help you
- 16 orient just with a date there.
- 17 A. I think when she ... So she wasn't in school yet, but
- 18 she was doing some courses online because I knew she had to take
- 19 her biology.
- 20 **Q.** Okay.
- 21 A. So when she was doing her biology while living in New
- 22 Brunswick, she got the car as well. So I'd say maybe 2011/2012.

- 1 Q. Okay. And did Lionel's behaviour around taking the
- 2 car away from her start in 2011 or did that happen later on?
- 3 A. That happened later on.
- 4 Q. Okay. And would that have happened sort of in
- 5 2015/2016, after he was released from the military? We know he
- 6 was released in the summer of 2015, so I'm using that as an
- 7 orientation. So would that behaviour around controlling the car
- 8 have happened after the summer of 2015?
- 9 A. Well, it happened when they were in New Brunswick.
- 10 They were living in New Brunswick, but he just really could not
- 11 drive the standard at all, so he couldn't even get it down the
- 12 driveway. But once he started learning more, it started
- 13 happening more frequently. So I would say 2014/2015.
- 14 Q. You referenced Lionel texting you, but in the course
- of the texts with you, he was talking to a "Dale"? Do you have
- 16 any idea who Dale is?
- 17 A. No idea.
- 18 Q. Okay. So you don't know if that's actually a person
- 19 or not. A friend or ...
- 20 A. I've never heard of a"Dale".
- 21 Q. Okay. So, to the best of your knowledge, that was
- 22 just part and parcel of the gibberish in terms of the texts that

- 1 Lionel would sometimes send?
- 2 **A.** Yes.
- 3 Q. Okay. You also indicated that he would refer to
- 4 himself as the devil or a demon, and that started in 2015/2016.
- 5 And he would do that when he was mad.
- **A.** Yeah.
- 7 O. That's how he would refer to himself? When he would
- 8 calm down after, I guess, the flare-up or the period of being
- 9 upset, did you ever have a conversation with him about why he
- 10 would call himself "a devil" or "demon"?
- 11 **A.** No.
- 12 **Q.** Okay.
- 13 A. I didn't. To me, it was just randomness that he used
- 14 to talk. And so when he was good, I just focused on him being
- 15 good. I didn't really bring up the negative.
- 16 Q. Okay. And then I think you had told my friend, Mr.
- 17 Russell, that your last conversation with Lionel on January the
- 18 1st, that was a phone call and it was about making plans to come
- 19 out to Regina for March break?
- 20 A. Mm-hmm. Yes.
- 21 Q. And do you remember what time, your time, you would've
- 22 gotten that call?

- 1 **A.** I'll say around 6:30/7:00 my time.
- 2 **Q.** A.m. or p.m.?
- 3 **A.** P.m.
- 4 Q. Okay. And then you indicated that he called you
- 5 again, or he contacted you again, on January the 2nd, but you
- 6 did not answer. Do you remem- ... That was by phone. Is that
- 7 correct?
- 8 **A.** Yes.
- 9 Q. And do you recall what time he would've called you on
- 10 January the 2nd?
- 11 A. It was morning. I'm not sure of the time, but it was
- 12 quite early, so I'd say around 7/8:00.
- 13 Q. Your time?
- 14 **A.** Yeah, a.m.
- 15 Q. Yeah, okay. Thank you. And did he leave a message in
- 16 that call?
- 17 A. No, he didn't.
- 18 Q. Okay. And then you indicated he called you again on
- 19 January the 3rd, early in the morning, as well. Before Shanna
- 20 had called you.
- 21 **A.** Yes.
- 22 Q. And from January the 3rd ... Sorry, January 1st to

- 1 January the 3rd, we talked about phone calls. Was there any
- 2 other communication that you had with Lionel? Text message?
- 3 Facebook Messenger? Any digital messaging that would've
- 4 happened from January 1st to January the 3rd?
- 5 **A.** No.
- 6 Q. Okay. Thank you, Shonda. Those are all my questions.
- 7 **A.** Thanks.
- 8 (16:40)
